The no on that last question is because illness prevents me from walking very far (even a block is difficult) or bicycling at all. I live about three blocks from the intersection of Carson and Mary. I have been delayed so much by the current on-grade crossing: I typically am northbound on Mary, and when the gates come down, I can count on at least five minutes delay, as (independent of where on the cycle the gates came down) when the gates go up, first traffic going straight on Evelyn continues briefly, and then left turns from Evelyn get to go, followed by more traffic going straight on Evelyn, and then left turns from Mary - finally, if another train does not come, I get my turn to go straight, northbound, on Mary. I am really looking forward to the completion of the grade separation! Perhaps with the railroad out of the picture, the lights at California and Mary can get synchronized - currently, when I finally get across Evelyn, I get stopped nine times out of ten because the light at California goes red. I'm looking forward to getting from Carson to Central (turning right at Central, I can pretty much ignore the light at Mary and Central) without stopping for a red light. I think I've done that once in all the years since the light at Callifornia was installed (before that light was installed, I could do it more frequently - I commuted that way from 1986-1989, taking Central, and from 1989-1997, staying on Mary to get to 101 southbound).

Again, these days illness prevents me from walking or bicycling. But I should mention that when I was commuting by bicycle, I crossed the tracks at Sunnyvale Avenue because climbing a hill on a bicycle was not easy for me - the flat crossing at Sunnyvale (then continuing on Hendy to get onto Kifer at Fair Oaks) was my chosen solution. I never had a safety issue with the tracks - I respect the trains, and gave them a wide berth. If I were healthy enough to bicycle, I would have a major problem with any of the grade separation solutions simply because they all involve riding uphill. There is never enough room to make the grade of the bicycle path low enough for me - unless there are hairpin bends (I fall over if I do not walk my bike through them - I did try a couple of times before I got sick to commute on the Stevens Creek bicycle trail, from Evelyn to the north side of 101), as there is rarely room for wider turns.

I think that the first option that preserves the car crossing is a bad idea because it ruins walkability of the Sunnyvale Ave. and Evelyn Ave. intersection (in order to prioritize vehicle traffic no less). The intersection is really close to where the Sunnyvale farmer's market is. The eastern section of downtown Sunnyvale is already low-traffic, has small streets, and is generally walkable/bikeable. It would be nice to keep it that way, since it's bordered by the extremely large Mathilda Ave. on the other side. Developing walkable urban areas and cities is good! Closing the intersection to cars does make it harder for cars to reach the south (main) entrance of the Caltrain station (which is important) from the north though, especially since Mathilda and Evelyn is such an awkward intersection.

It also seems like Sunnyvale Ave. is being framed as an important biking route (especially from Borregas Ave.), and eliminating the car crossing makes biking on Sunnyvale Ave. north of the intersection better because it reduces car traffic. On the stretch of Sunnyvale Ave. between California Ave. and Evelyn Ave., cars may conflict with bikes due to the narrow width of the road, especially when there are cars parked on either side (which there often are). One time I biked that stretch and the car behind me honked at me and aggressively passed me because they had to wait behind me when there was traffic in the other direction.

Ultimately, I think this intersection would be better if it prioritized pedestrians, bikes, and a world with less cars (public transportation is okay:)).

Almost all traffic is motor vehicles; despite the projections the primary traffic delay is, and will continues to be, the signal delay for vehicles on Mary and Evelyn crossing the other road. Both options presented eliminate the delay for Caltrains, but the option without the Jughandle does not eliminate the primary delay.

I am appalled that the option to build a bridge for Mary to cross over both the tracks and Evelyn appears to have already been eliminated, despite it manifestly having less impact, and I suspect being faster and cheaper to implement.

In any case, the Mary reconstruction should be scheduled to not overlap construction at nearby crossings of the tracks at Mathilda or the 237. And prior to beginning construction, the delay to cross the tracks and Evelyn should be minimized by a simple (and extremely low cost) change of the signal phasing to make the Mary through phase occur immediately after the crossing gates are raised (currently, the Evelyn through phases occur immediately after a train passage, and sometimes the signal never reaches the Mary through phase before the next train passage - I have seen delays upwards of 5 minutes due to this).

I have found the tracks to be an insignificant delay when on foot or bicycling, but I have found pedestrian/cycle underpasses at other locations to be far more unpleasant that a level crossing of tracks - bicycles passing in the confined space are a greater hazard than the trains, the tunnel confines people where they can be preyed upon by muggers and panhandlers, and they are noisy and collect unpleasant smells and debris.

I also wonder if the plan has considered the effects of flooding due to storm drain blockage and/or unusually heavy rains.

As to the effect on vehicle traffic, the narrowing of Sunnnyvale Ave. to one lane and the grossly conservative timing of the signals has almost eliminated its value, even while the adjacent Fair Oaks crossing has been crippled by reconstruction there. Unless the recent degradation of vehicle traffic flow on Sunnyvale Ave. is reversed, the money for either of the proposed options would have been better spent adding another vehicle lane to Fair Oaks or Mathilda.

I also see no evidence that a bridge over the tracks was considered, despite it having manifestly lower impact, and I suspect lower cost and time to implement, and not creating or revealing a host of new and/or unforeseen problems by attempting to dig a big ditch in the densest part of the downtown area.

Vehicle traffic flow could instead be significantly improved by a simple (and very cheap) change in the phasing of the signal at Sunnyvale and Evelyn so that the north-south Sunnyvale Ave. through phases occur immediately after the crossing gates are raised (instead of the current configuration which makes the Evelyn through phases occur after the

crossing gates are raised, delaying the north-south through phases, sometimes until another train passes, resetting the signal to the Evelyn through phases again - potentially repeatedly). For a higher but still comparatively small cost, the Sunnyvale Caltrain station boarding platform could be moved a bit further west, so that it is not so close that it keeps the crossing gates down while trains board.

The jughandle option is better for cyclists heading north on Evelyn (which I do often) because there is never traffic turning/coming from the left side. In the underpass plan, cyclists on Evelyn have to deal with turning cars (which is already bad with the lack of a dedicated right turn lane on Evelyn northbound at Mary).

Similarly, cyclists going westbound on Mary no longer have conflicts with vehicles on the right.

The jughandle also keeps Evelyn at grade, so cyclists don't have to climb up the slope from the underpass to surface level.

Please lay out the bicycle lanes on the jughandle in a way that gives cyclists a green left turn lane, and make the right auto lane on the jughandle northbound a dedicated right turn lane.

If you make the bicycle lane on Evelyn northbound a separated lane, and the bicycle lane on Mary westbound a separated lane, it would allow for cyclists to always have a green signal. This would encourage cycling in this area.

If you want to encourage cyclists to use this underpass, the bike flow should be smooth without sharp turns. There's space next to the tracks on the north side; can that be used for a more smoothly-flowing ramp? The Evelyn-side ramp also needs to provide a smooth transition for cyclists taking any of the three directions from that side.

Alternatively, has a bicycle/pedestrian bridge been considered for this intersection? It could curve to the north to meet Hendy.

Since this under crossing option prevents auto traffic between Sunnyvale Ave at this point, it will increase traffic accessing Lowlanders via California Ave from Mathilda to Sunnyvale Ave. That section of California Ave is narrow, with parked cars and the turn onto Central, and I think with increased traffic you'd need to ban parking from it to ease flow.

I briefly looked at RR grade requirements. SPRR's freight requirement is the strictest, allowing a 1% grade. US rail tunnel heights vary, the tallest I could find is 24 feet. For argument, assume we need to lower the railbed 30 feet to allow for a 24 foot tall tunnel plus 6 feet (guess) for the cover structure. At 1% grade, that would stretch the project 3000 feet on each end, roughly to the N. Fair Oaks Ave overcrossing on the south end, and near the 237 overcrossing on the north end.

I'm not in construction, but 3 existing tracks fit in that 75 foot easement parallel to Hendy Ave, and there's 4 tracks in an 80 foot easement near Wolfe Ave. So maybe both tracks can be lowered while keeping two tracks operating. If not, the two existing Caltrain/UPRR tracks could be lowered one at a time, using the current easement for 2 operating tracks plus space to construct the third. There's no other at grade road crossings or expensive looking infrastructure. At downtown is the Caltrain "station," a simple concrete platform. Construction would go under the existing Fair Oaks Ave overcrossing. Also at the south end is a short section with 4 existing tracks. If the RR companies need the entire length of the 4 track section, there is space in the rail easement near Bowers Ave where the 4 tracks merge to two. The entire 4 track section could be shifted south during construction.

My main issue with the Pedestrian/Bicycle option is that blocking off Sunnyvale Ave car access would divert traffic to California Ave (cutting over to either Fair Oaks or Mathilda). This stretch of California Ave is already way too busy as it is - it is a residential area with a lot of traffic, with the Central Expressway connection for cars as well as bicycles & pedestrians traveling down Frances to access the Caltrain station. Between Sunnyvale Ave and Mathilda, there is not a single crosswalk or any method of car traffic control (stop signs, speed tables/humps) and the road is so narrow that there is no bike lane at all, making biking feel unsafe.

The speed limit on Cal Ave is 25 (from Fair Oaks to Sunnyvale Ave to Mathilda to Mary) and people drive MUCH faster on all those stretches. It is already difficult and unsafe to cross California Ave at Frances or to cross any direction at the three-way intersection where San Anselmo connects to Central.

California Ave at least feels safer to walk/bike between Fair Oaks & Sunnyvale and between Mathilda & Mary - the street is much wider, there is an all-way stop at California & Sobrante (the connection to Central Expwy South on the other side of Mathilda), a somewhat decent crosswalk at Northrop Grumman. If the Pedestrian/Bicycle Underpass option is chosen, I would strongly urge the addition of safety measures on California Ave and consideration of the effect that increased traffic through this residential area might have.
