I recognize that the current State budget and fiscal landscape are uncertain and in flux. I am writing to respectfully inquire whether there may be an opportunity to direct state funding toward a critical public safety need for Sunnyvale.

The City of Sunnyvale seeks \$1,000,000 in Proposition 4, Chapter 3 (Wildfire and Forest Resilience) funding to enable the Department of Public Safety (DPS) to purchase a much-needed ladder fire apparatus to replace a unit that has reached the end of its reliable service life. This investment is essential to maintaining effective emergency response capabilities, ensuring firefighter safety, and preserving operational readiness for complex incidents such as multi-story structure fires, technical rescues, and providing coverage during increasingly frequent wildland-urban interface fire events. Sunnyvale has enabled the development of multiple high-rise residential projects, and this apparatus is critical to help make sure that our high-rise residents are safe.

This apparatus would also support regional mutual aid responses, allowing Sunnyvale to continue meeting its obligations and assisting neighboring jurisdictions during large-scale emergencies. DPS has an active apparatus build team in place, including subject matter experts, Fleet staff, and a manufacturer aligned on core specifications to ensure the vehicle is durable, maintainable, and cost-effective over its lifecycle. State funding would directly support the timely replacement of critical fire infrastructure and strengthen both local and regional emergency response capacity.



I understand the magnitude of a \$1,000,000 million request. However, as climate change accelerates and wildfire risks grow more frequent and severe, Sunnyvale must be equipped to meet increasing demands by deploying its wildland rigs. Therefore, this ladder fire apparatus will be operationally ready to provide coverage during those events. Without this funding, the City will be forced to rely on aging and unreliable apparatus that could fail during an emergency, potentially putting lives at risk.

I am confident this request aligns with the goals of Proposition 4 and represents a prudent and impactful investment of state resources. Thank you for your consideration and for your continued commitment to protecting our environment, our community, and our residents. I recognize the magnitude of a \$1,000,000 investment. As climate change accelerates and wildfire risks increase in both frequency and severity, Sunnyvale's need to remain fully equipped to meet rising demands becomes increasingly clear particularly as wildland deployments grow more frequent. A reliable ladder apparatus plays an essential role in maintaining uninterrupted coverage during these events. Absent this investment, the City could face greater reliance on aging equipment at critical moments, creating avoidable risk to lives and property.

Thank you for your consideration and for your steadfast commitment to protecting our environment, our communities, and the residents we collectively serve.
