Budget: \$27,000 In late 2019 I walked into Facebook's new, spacious Fremont, CA campus and brought them *The Land of Magic Awaits*, a turbulent, tangled universe of land and sky. The Facebook mural installation is 10' x 40' and includes a playful variety of media including paint, glitter, glass eyes, painted objects, constructed nature, yarn, pompoms, and fabric installed onto a unique wallpaper. Inspired by my work in the garden, this project captures the predictable, yet unpredictable twists and turns of the natural world. As is the case with much of my work, the

A set of two paintings titled *Magic in the Hinterland I and Magic in the Hinterland II* were commissioned for the UCSF Hospital Pediatric Ward. The imagery in these pieces is seemingly chaotic with a lively terrain is that's bursting with activity. As a strategy to encourage engagement and discovery for viewers of all ages, I embedded a set of six foxes (all in different poses) into the weave of flora, color and pattern.

My commissioned tapestry created for Sunnyvale's LEED Certified City Hall provides a visual experience that is rich and textured. The vibrant and welcoming imagery animates the community space of City Hall, draws the public into a visual dialog, and adds a friendly warmth to the space. The narrative is a bright weave of nature-based imagery, both enchanting and accessible.

The piece was woven in Brussels, Belgium, and once it was back in the studio I enhanced the surface with neon pigments, metallic threads, buttons, beads and more. Activating the surface with a variety of mixed media further heightens the viewer's experience and offers new discoveries at every viewing.

For me, the garden becomes a metaphor for the universe. I am continually captured by nature's sheer exuberance—a spectacle of complexity—beautiful, simple and haphazard.

City of Sunnyvale, Corn Palace Park Bench Proposal by Carrie Lederer The Land of Magic: Garden in the Cosmos



The Land of Magic: Garden in the Cosmos, 2025, 72" x 18", High-fired Porcelain Tile

Corn Palace Park will be a civic oasis of green where visitors can relax and play—a place to enjoy time away from the hustle and bustle of Silicon Valley. Its name is a reminder of another time, when orchards and fruit stands were part of the community fabric. In this proposal, I will expand on my application to the January RFQ that is shaping Corn Palace's future. I have reflected on the current state of the area, as well as its history, to conceptualize this artwork specifically for a bench in Corn Palace Park.

BENCH CONCEPT

The public artwork that I'm proposing is called *The Land of Magic: Garden in the Cosmos*. The concept is a weave of imagery that offers a portal into a magical land—the natural world we all share, and it also includes a poignant nod to Sunnyvale's agricultural history. It invites visitors to discover what's hiding in plain sight and to be transported to another time and space.

The bench is chock-full of visual prompts that take visitors on a journey across the land and cosmos. From a distance, the bold, cheerful colors are like a beacon—they entice visitors to come closer. Up-close, there are many elements to discover across the bench's surface. Some are camouflaged, inspiring a visual scavenger hunt; there are surprises to find with every visit. Bright and cheerful clusters of apricots are sprinkled throughout, as a visual connection to Sunnyvale's early economic development in Silicon Valley. A fox, some birds, and a squirrel activate the surreal landscape and are surrounded with a flurry of color, pattern, and texture. The sky and waters of the bench are full of stars, constellations, and even flying saucers—all are part of the tapestry-like format that is bursting with energy.

My intention with this artwork is to imagine the earth's mystical wonders, and my hope is that the visitors will be drawn into an enchanting wondrous fairy forest. I'm fascinated by nature's mycorrhizal networks—threadlike connectors that form plant-to-plant exchanges of nutrients and water—that make life possible. Here in The Land of Magic, the trees whisper secrets carried by the wind, their roots entangled with the very fabric of the universe. Fireflies flicker like fallen stars, guiding wanderers through mossy pathways and glowing blooms.

THEME

My work is inspired by a curiosity about nature and our connection to it, and I believe this connection is important to many in the community. My imagery reflects the vital relationship between land, water, and sky and the beauty and fragile state of the natural world. The weave of activity that visitors find on the bench mimics the kaleidoscope that is all around us. We must slow down and take time to reflect if we want to experience this Land of Magic.





PROCESS / MATERIALS

My artwork will be created with tiles produced by Unique Tiles, a U.K. company that has been a part of a vast array of successful projects—both commercial and fine art. My image will be transferred onto high-grade porcelain body tiles, which are fired at high temperatures of 1650 F, 900 C, ensuring a durable product that can handle extreme climates, both heat (up to 1292 F, 700 C) and cold (tiles are frost proof and will not crack).

The tiles are resistant to UV rays and are guaranteed not to fade for up to 50 years. They have a glossy, scratchproof surface and graffiti can be removed without harm to the tile surface. The tiles are suitable for high traffic areas, and the surface is smooth and comfortable to sit on. I will use a pre-fabricated cement bench as the substrate. Once the bench is buckled onto its footings, the tile composition will be installed onsite. Depending on the type of bench, the image will be 72" long and 24" (or 18") wide.
