What is a Hate Crime?

Hate Crime: a criminal act committed, in whole or in part, because of one or more of the following actual or perceived characteristics of the victim: disability; gender; nationality; race or ethnicity; religion; sexual orientation; or who associates with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics.

What is a Hate Incident?

A Hate Incident: An action or behavior motivated by hate but legally protected by the First Amendment right to freedom of expression.

Examples include:


Name-calling, Insults, Displaying hate material that does not result in property damage and Distribution of materials with hate messages in public places.

Who Can Be a Victim?

A victim is any person, public agency, or private institution that is threatened or injured or has his/her property damaged because of his/her race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, disability, gender or sexual orientation. However, a victim may also be threatened or injured because the criminal perceives the victim to be of a certain race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, disability, gender or sexual orientation.



