



Visitor Counts FY 2017/18 – FY 2023/24




Total Circulation FY 2017/18 – FY 2023/24










E-Collection Circulation FY 2017/18 – FY 2023/24




Non-Book Circulation FY 2017/18 – FY 2023/24



Children's Circulation FY 2017/18 – FY 2023/24




Circulation Analysis FY 2017/18 – FY 2023/24






Adult Appetit!
