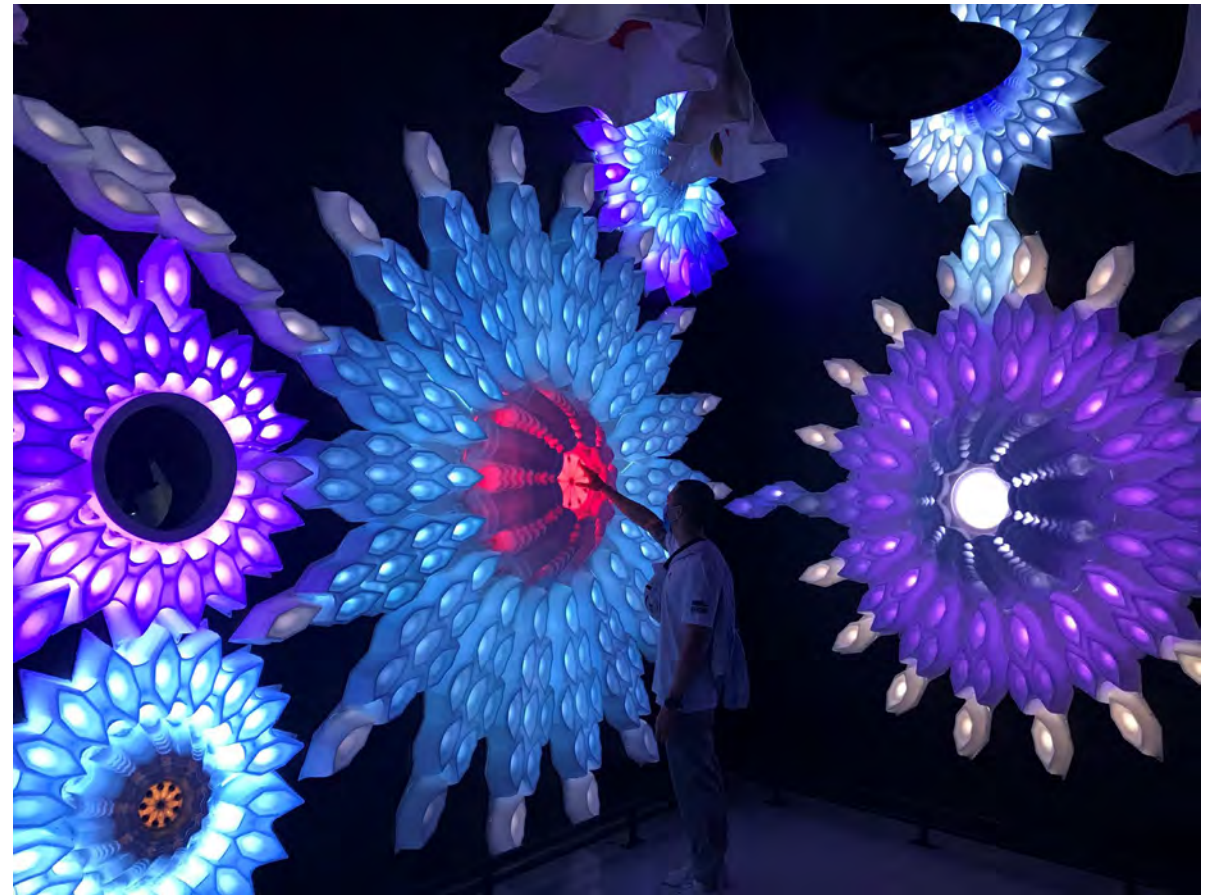
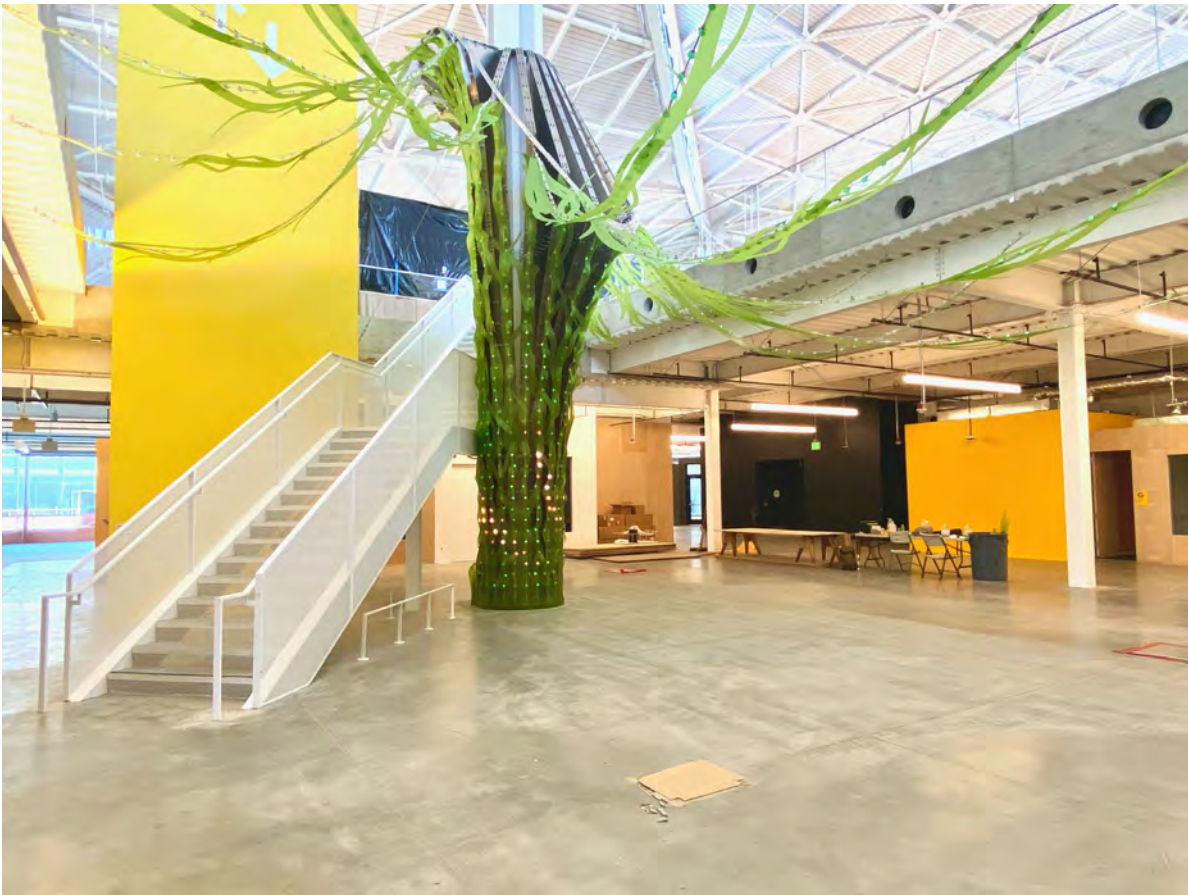
1. **Seagrass:** Inspired by the flowing form of seagrass on the gulf, the vision for "SEAGRASS" was to capture a singular moment in time when the leaves danced in the water. Its interactive lighting responds to live data being collected from weather stations at Cocodrie and hydrographic instruments behind the property.
  - a. Commissioned By: Louisiana Universities Marine Consortium (LUMCON)

  - d. Size: 13' x 31' x 17'
  - e. Materials: Recycled PETG Sheeting, Laser Cut Stainless Steel, Stainless steel cable, and interactive LED lighting
  - f. Budget: \$90,000
  
2. **Nest -** Created for Adams County's new park maintenance facility, the sculpture is inspired by the staff's dedication to the vast trails and parks system they manage. Taking elements from their daily experiences and the native wetlands here, the design includes details like metal shovel-heads, colorful cattail-like tendrils, and firefly-like lighting.

3. **Woven:** This sculpture interlaces hundreds of distinct powder-coated metal panels to create a form inspired by the region's agricultural history and diverse communities. The local community and indigenous groups were also directly engaged to ensure their voices were reflected in the artwork.

4. **Journey -** A collection of 4 colossal fungi with varying heights and colors that adorn and illuminate a new forest path. Installed in Walker Johnston Park at Urbandale's North Walnut Creek access, the installation offers an experience that is both utilitarian and whimsical.

5. **Hyphae:** An abstraction of a great oak tree and mycelium networks, this permanent sculpture utilizes specialized eco-resin and a unique engineering approach to span close to 2 floors. A network of lights react to the flow of human traffic in the space, traveling through the piece as if carrying information through the root system.

6. **Sessilanoid at Meow Wolf** - This sculpture is inspired by barnacle formations and cellular growth. Interactive push buttons allow viewers to trigger custom lighting patterns and soundscapes inspired by nature. Originally showcased at Art Basel, a permanent version of this sculpture now lives at Meow Wolf's Omega Mart.

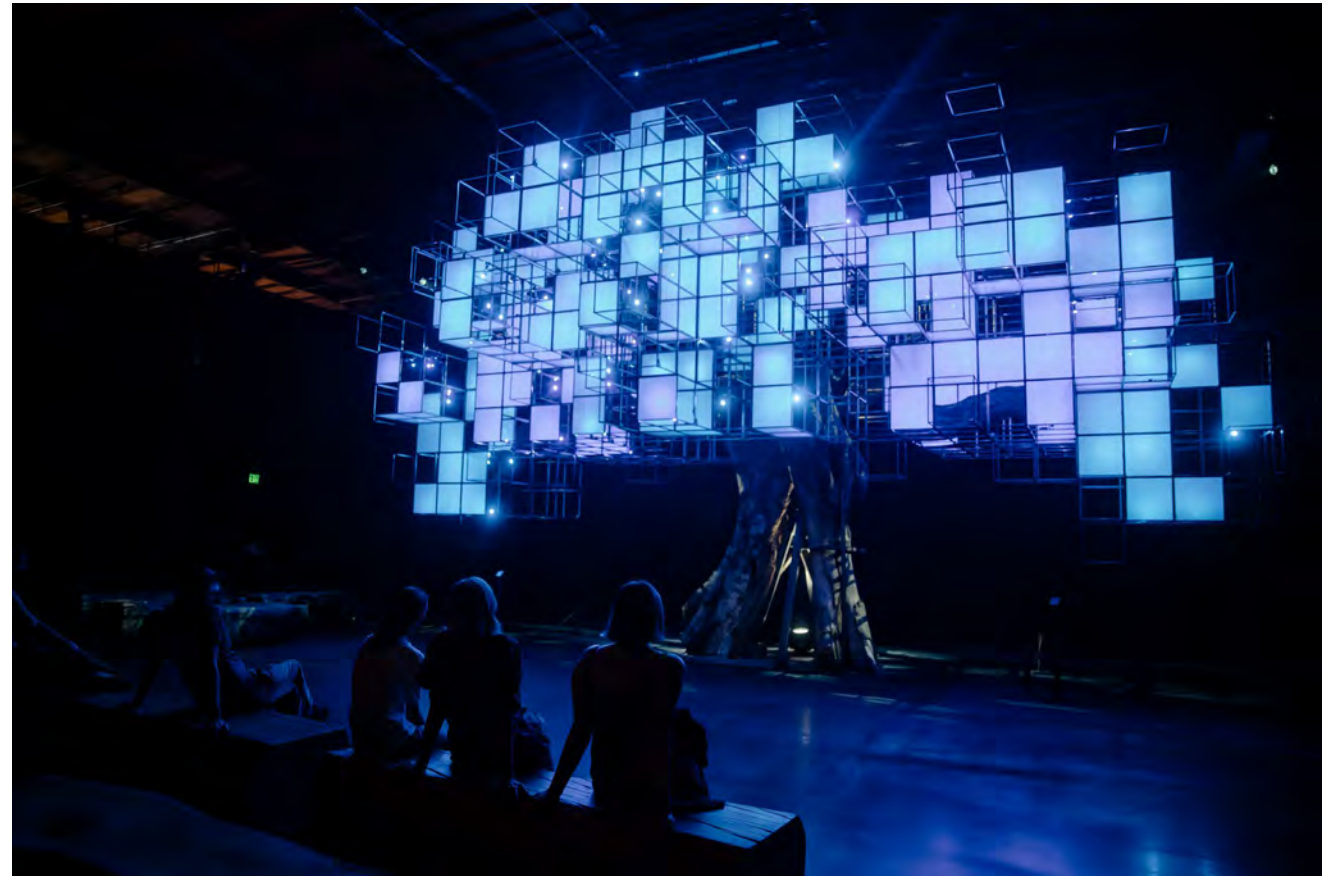
9. **Atari Light by Pierre Huyghe** - Originally created in 1999, the piece was revamped and brought to life again after its recent commission for the One Liberty Plaza building in New York. The interactive installation is made from a grid of 144 square white lights and its integration into this skyscraper's renovation required careful planning.

10. **A Forest for the Trees by Glenn Kaino** - Built from the actual tree trunk of a 144-year old Moreton Bay Fig that collapsed in 2019, this hero sculpture from Glenn Kaino's exhibition highlighted Native American forestry traditions, the increasing wildfire risk, and the need for climate action. Steel cubes with illuminated panels recreated the tree's canopy, and performances with programmed music and lighting effects made the tree come to life again.

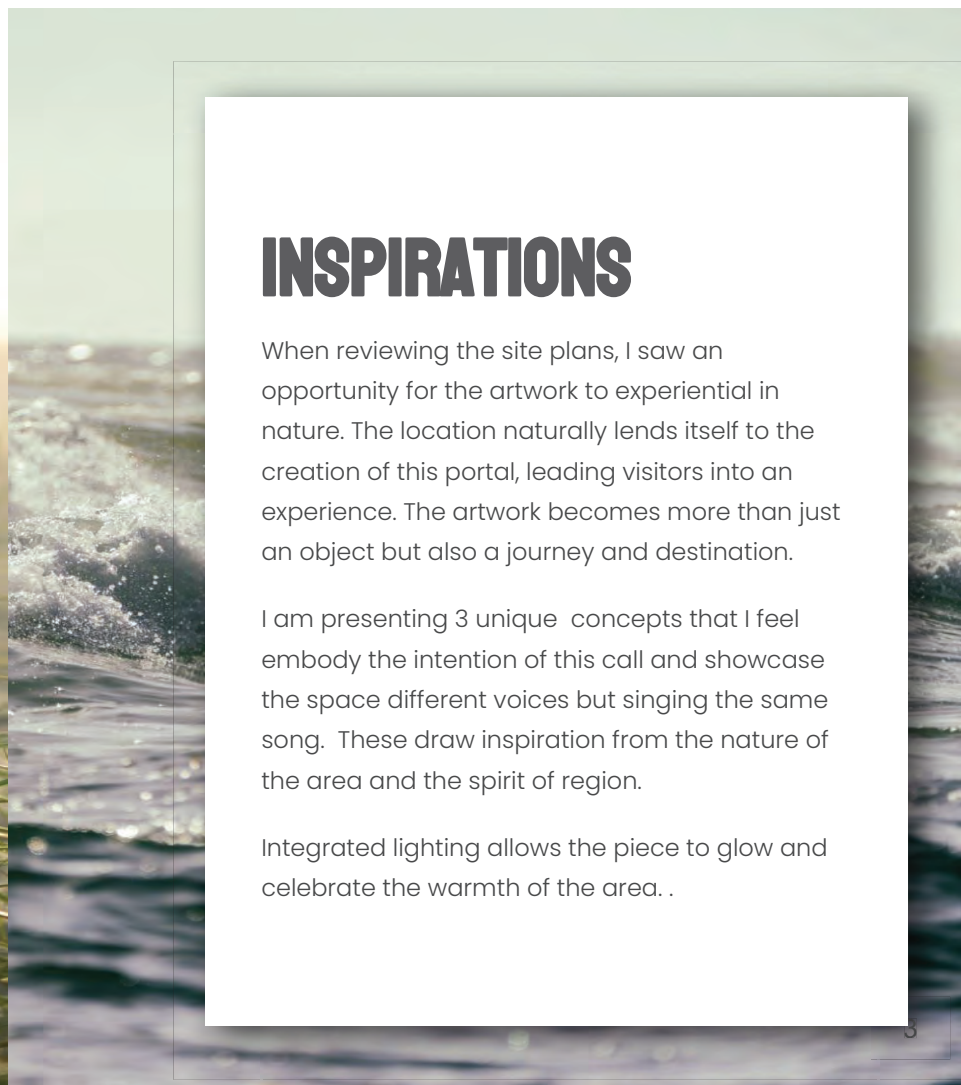
## INTRODUCTION

Warmly enveloped within a communal space like the Plaza Del Sol, **'JOY'** invites the community in - providing a place for connection and inspiration.



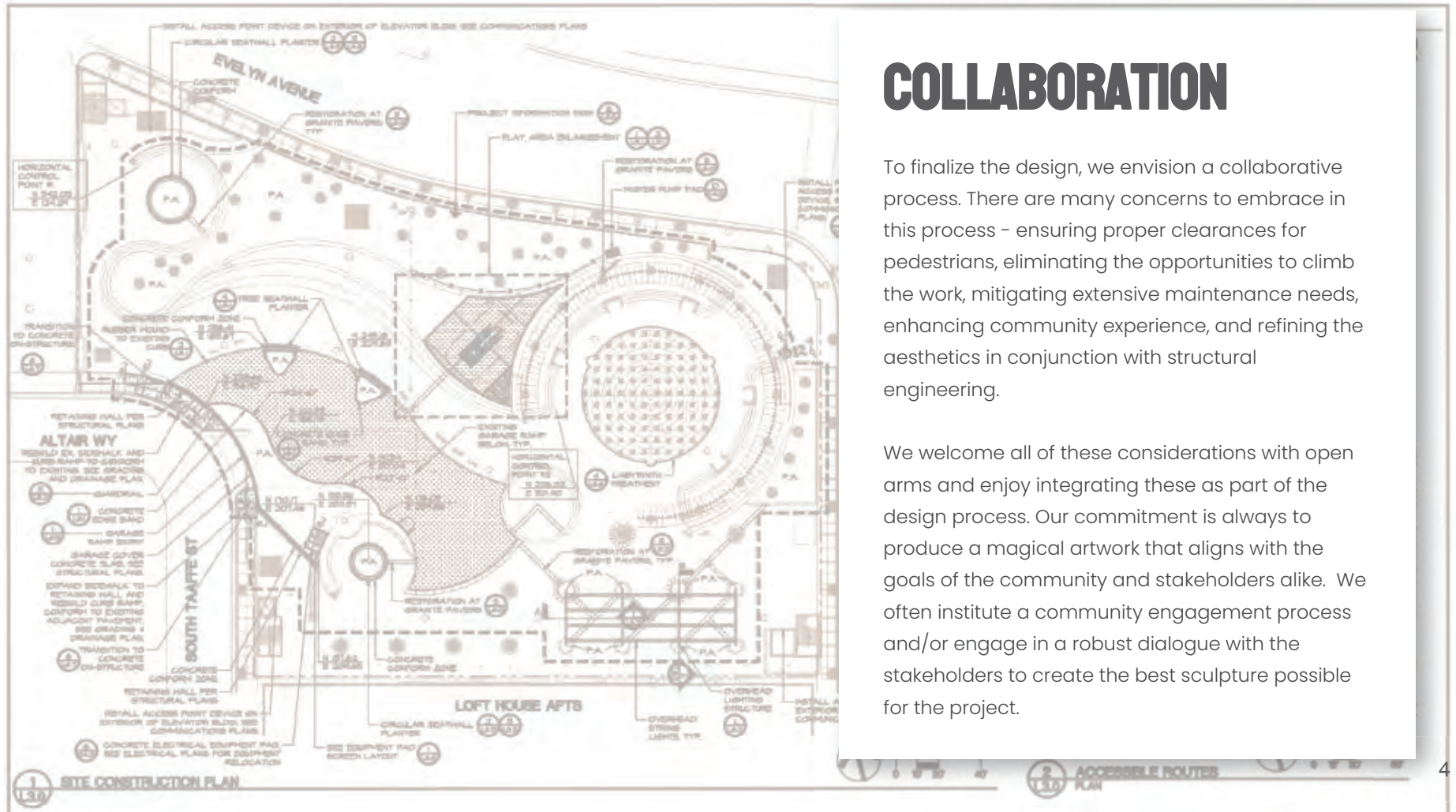


## INSPIRATIONS

I am presenting 3 unique concepts that I feel embody the intention of this call and showcase the space different voices but singing the same song. These draw inspiration from the nature of the area and the spirit of region.

Integrated lighting allows the piece to glow and celebrate the warmth of the area. .



## COLLABORATION

To finalize the design, we envision a collaborative process. There are many concerns to embrace in this process - ensuring proper clearances for pedestrians, eliminating the opportunities to climb the work, mitigating extensive maintenance needs, enhancing community experience, and refining the aesthetics in conjunction with structural engineering.

We welcome all of these considerations with open arms and enjoy integrating these as part of the design process. Our commitment is always to produce a magical artwork that aligns with the goals of the community and stakeholders alike. We often institute a community engagement process and/or engage in a robust dialogue with the stakeholders to create the best sculpture possible for the project.

## DESIGN

When evaluating this call for art I looked at the site and tried to imagine how the art would feel. What the experience would be like to walk in, through and around the art. Additionally I considered the amount of area allocated for the art and how best to embrace the space. Additionally I feel that whichever approach we pursue working with modularity is important so the work can be assembled on site and design adjustments after deeper analysis of parameters of the location can inform any value engineering necessary.



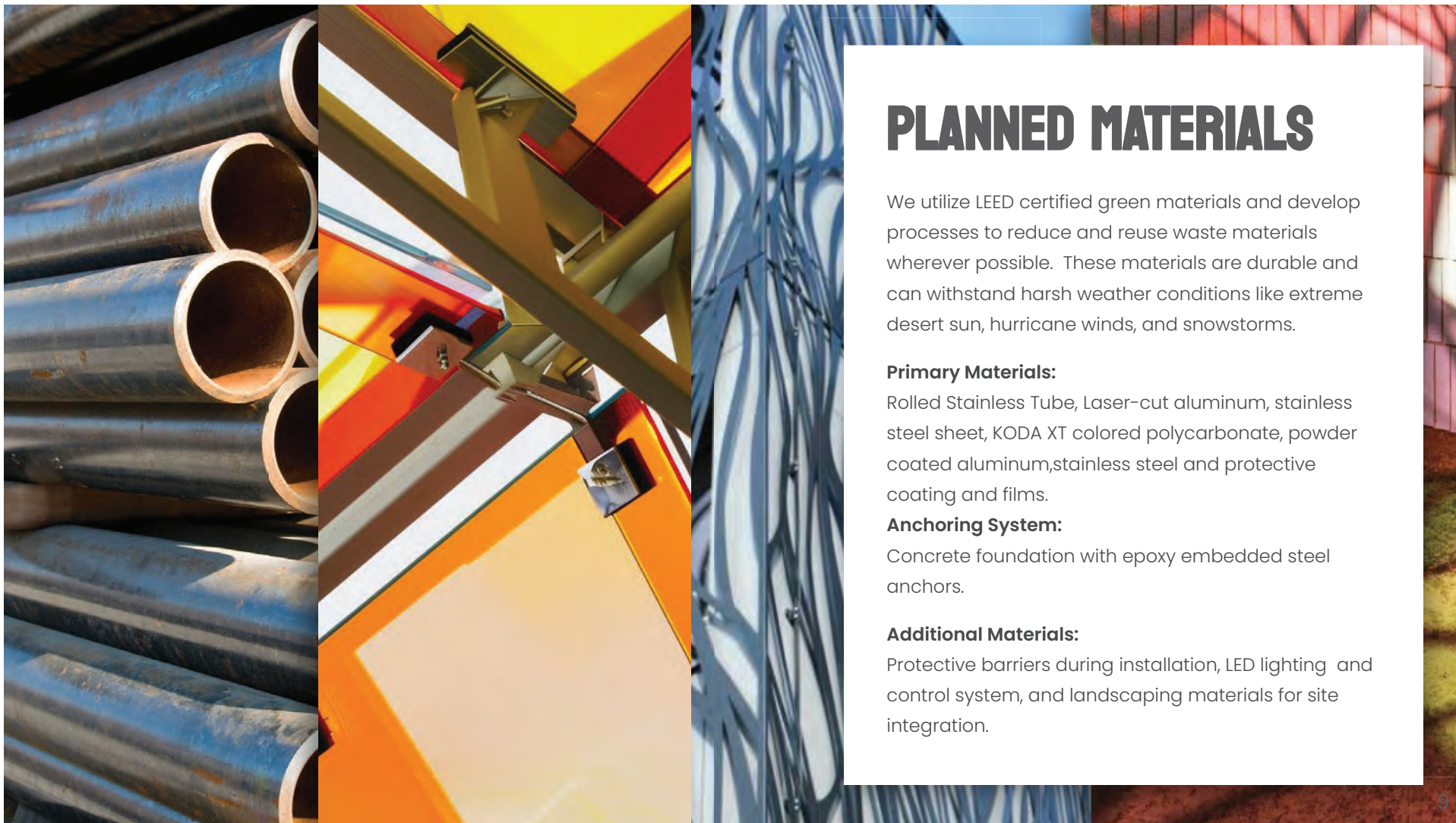

## PLANNED MATERIALS

We utilize LEED certified green materials and develop processes to reduce and reuse waste materials wherever possible. These materials are durable and can withstand harsh weather conditions like extreme desert sun, hurricane winds, and snowstorms.

### **Primary Materials:**

Rolled Stainless Tube, Laser-cut aluminum, stainless steel sheet, KODA XT colored polycarbonate, powder coated aluminum, stainless steel and protective coating and films.

### **Anchoring System:**

Concrete foundation with epoxy embedded steel anchors.

### **Additional Materials:**

Protective barriers during installation, LED lighting and control system, and landscaping materials for site integration.

## ABOUT KODA XT

KODA XT is a virtually unbreakable, LEED-certified exterior material by 3Form that offers exceptional durability and color options. Its impact resistance surpasses acrylic by 60 times and glass by 100, unmatched in the glazing market.

## POWER & LIGHTING

The lighting system will be designed for versatility, allowing for different programming requirements, such as warm, soft lighting to create an inviting ambiance for quiet nights, or more dynamic patterns to energize special events. The slow delicate rhythms like that of rustling leaves, or wind are some ideas we are considering to embrace to elevate the sense of wonder within the artwork.

We anticipate power needs to be 2 circuits of 110 VAC @ 20 amps.
