The schools proposed for these **Safe Routes projects** have a combined enrollment of 1,200 students with a high percentage of socio-economically disadvantaged families. **Investing in these neighborhoods will improve overall health, safety, and connectivity.**

I am writing to express my sincere support for the City of Sunnyvale's request for funding to support the City's Safer Routes to School and Parks projects.

Planned safety improvements include corner curb and sidewalk extensions, pedestrian safety signs and striping, ADA curb ramps, and a pedestrian hybrid-activated beacon at a busy arterial. These improvements will lead to reduced vehicle speeds and congestion, expand and connect walking and biking paths, and overall decrease negative environmental impacts.
