- ~37 City staff members regularly support, staff and facilitate Sunnyvale's 10 B/Cs (60 members)
- Quarterly meetings: hosted by City Clerk for B/C Liaisons and other key staff
- B/C policy changes require significant effort and collaboration (+ budget, potentially)

# Joint Study Session with B/C Chairs and Vice Chairs

#### • Nov. 14, 2023

- 17 suggested improvements or modifications
  - 10 administrative
  - 7 policy-based

## Potential Study Issues (2 items)

- 1. Create transportation B/C
- Expand scope of Heritage Preservation Commission

#### Subcommittee Recommendation to City Council (1 of 2)

#### Policy Change Consideration

- Add an item to each B/C's annual work plan to review and propose new supplemental questions for B/C application
- Supplemental questions assist Councilmembers in evaluating B/C applicants

- Add one-time or as-needed instead of annual review
  - E.g., review interview questions no less than every 5 years (terms are 4 years)

#### Subcommittee Recommendation to City Council (2 of 2)

#### Policy Change Consideration

 Modify this year's Arts Commission work plan to add dynamic, interactive and literary art forms

Note: in addition to work plan, Arts Commission annually reviews several public art projects (e.g., utility box art, Sunnyvale Suns), Civic Center artwork and AIPD\*

\*Art in Private Development

- Request that Subcommittee identify work plan items of interest
- Any items Subcommittee would like Council to consider removing?

#### Policy Items Returning to the Subcommittee (1 of 5)

#### Policy Change Consideration

 Policy that would permit all B/Cs to have member led presentations, so long as they fit in the work plan and do not require staff time to prepare

- No policy modification needed; current policy & practice allow (time permitting)
  - Proposals for member led presentations may be made via staff liaison
  - ◆ B/C Chair to ensure agenda items are in alignment with approved work plan

#### Policy Items Returning to the Subcommittee (2 of 5)

#### Policy Change Consideration

 Policy to allow B/C to authorize Chair to provide written communication related to a member led presentation to the City Council

- Member led presentations are informational; Brown Act does not allow action
- Any B/C Member may contact Council at any time on own behalf

#### Policy Items Returning to the Subcommittee (3 of 5)

#### Policy Change Consideration

- Increase size of Board of Library Trustees from five (5) to seven (7) members
- Would require amendment to City Charter

- Challenges filling current five positions
- Fiscal impact \$136,926 for Nov 2026 charter amendment + staff resources to support Charter amendment and additional Commissioners
- Recommend maintaining Board of Library Trustees at its current size unless an identified need arises to pursue charter amendment

#### Policy Items Returning to the Subcommittee (4 of 5)

#### Policy Change Consideration

- Increase size of Human Relations Commission (HRC) from five (5) to seven (7) members
- Would <u>not</u> require amendment to City Charter; update to Council Policy

- No challenge currently with interest in serving on the HRC
- Broadens community representation on the Committee
- Increases staff time to support additional Commissioners
- Staff makes no recommendation

#### Policy Items Returning to the Subcommittee (5 of 5)

#### Policy Change Consideration

 Allow B/C members to communicate with members of the public via Cityissued email addresses

Note: Current Council Policy prohibits B/C members from representing their B/C outside of public meetings.

- Staff recommends continuing current practice using B/C AnswerPoint for public comments and communication
  - Ensures information is readily available to all members and City staff
- If B/C members granted City email, additional policy clarification and budget modification will be necessary (\$20k/year + 60-70 hrs/year of ITD support)

#### Potential Study Issues (1 of 2)

#### Considerations

 Create a transportation commission or adjust the scope of an existing commission such as Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee (BPAC) or Sustainability to include more transportation issues

#### **Staff Comments**

- Existing BPAC advises City Council on bicycle and pedestrian issues
- City's current regional partners on transportation: Councilmembers appointed to Santa Clara County Expressway 2040, Valley Transportation Authority (VTA) and VTA B/Cs, Caltrain Local Policy Maker Group and Councilappointed community member to VTA-BPAC.

#### Potential Study Issues (2 of 2)

#### Considerations

 Expand scope of Heritage Preservation Commission to include more community engagement and Sunnyvale history

#### **Staff Comments**

- Heritage Preservation Commission scope includes advising capacity to Council and has decision-making authority on restoration, maintenance and operation of heritage resources
- All B/Cs are charged with providing a forum and opportunity for broad community input

#### Fiscal and Staffing Impacts

- Creating new or significantly expanded B/C(s)
  - Staff would analyze resource needs for Council consideration
  - Board of Library Trustees would require charter amendment (est. cost \$136,926 in Nov 2026 election + costs of public info/staff support)

- Providing City email accounts to B/C members
  - Licensing cost of ~\$20k/yr (budget mod)
  - 60-70 hrs/yr IT staff support
