### Overview of Program

- DPS's Animal Control Program consists of the following:
  - One (1.0 FTE) Senior Community Services Officer
  - One (1.0 FTE) Animal Control Officer
  - One (1) Animal Control Vehicle
- Agreement with external service provider for shelter services
  - HSSV until February 1, 2025
  - Santa Clara County beginning on February 1, 2025



# Program Budget

#### Services Provided

- Investigate reports of stray, nuisance, injured, abused, neglected and dangerous animals.
- Impound stray, injured, aggressive or dangerous animals.
- Enforce codes, ordinances, and regulations pertaining to the care and control of animals.
- Remove and dispose of deceased animals.


### Shelter Services Recap - HSSV

- Humane Society Silicon Valley (HSSV) served as Sunnyvale's animal services provider for 18 years (since April 19, 2007).
- On December 16, 2024, a fire severely damaged HSSV's Milpitas facility, impacting operations.
- On January 28, 2025, HSSV notified the city of its intent to terminate services effective February 1, 2025.
- HSSV estimated a two-year repair timeline.
- City and HSSV mutually agreed to terminate the agreement via official notice delivered June 6, 2025.

### **Current Shelter Services - County**

- On February 1, 2025, City and County entered into an agreement under an emergency procurement
- County of Santa Clara Animal Shelter does not impound healthy stray cats
- Shelter approach to community cats:
  - Impounding causes stress to cats
  - Cats can return home on their own without intervention
  - Fewer than 2% of impounded cats are reclaimed by owners
- SMC 6.05.010 related to impounding healthy stray cats suspended by Council Resolution 1289-25 on April 22, 2025





 Since the suspension of SMC 6.05.010 on April 22, 2025 via Resolution 1289-25, related to impounding healthy stray cats, animal control has tracked 19 calls for service that did not meet the impound criteria outlined above.

### **Next Steps**

 Additional resources for animal services will be evaluated and, if needed, proposed during future budget cycles.

 Staff has begun development of solicitation materials and plans to go out to bid in mid 2026.

 In the meantime, the City will exercise a 1-year extension for shelter services with the County.
