


Golf Course Services Budget \$4.4 million

- 18 Holes, Par 70, Regulation Layout
- Built by City
- Opened 1968

Sunken Gardens Golf Course

- 9 Holes, Par 29, Executive Course
- 24 Stall driving range
- Purchased by the City in early 70's



Las Palmas Tennis Center

- Operator Lifetime Activities
- 15 Courts
- 4 Pickleball Courts
- Cafe
- Locker Room
- Tennis Lessons

Adopted - September 2014

- 2007 Study Issues (DPW 07-16-07) on the sustainability of large street trees.
- 2008 City determined need for Urban Forest Management Plan and received grant from California State Department of Forestry.
- Plan completed by Phytosphere Research in 2011.
- Overall goal of the UFMP is to help sustain, protect, and enhance the urban forest to maximize the many benefits that it provides.



Funding provided by Proposition 40 through the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection Urban and Community Forestry Program



Brightview Tree Services

- Budget \$466,630
- Contract Services = Structural Pruning, Removals, Planting,
- Pruning = 3,500 trees



Root Mitigation


Original soil line prior to excavation. Soil cover over the lateral roots is about 12". This would be considered deep rooted.

Distance between the soil line and the asphalt is about four feet. The bulk of the roots are in the one to two foot range

PROGRAM INDICATORS

- Safe

Parks and open spaces are free from hazardous conditions, with reported hazardous conditions abated within 24 hours of notice.

- Attractive

Staff survey of Parks Components indicate parks and open spaces meet the Parks Division standards for attractiveness as listed in the Parks

- Usable

Staff survey of Parks Components indicate parks and open spaces meet the Parks Division standards for usability as listed in the Parks Division Quality Standards manual.

- Customer Satisfaction

Targeted customer satisfaction rating is met based on surveys distributed to Sunnyvale park users in May of March fiscal year.

- Budget

Actual total expenditures for 780 acres of Neighborhood Parks and Open Space Management will not exceed planned program expenditures.

Park Dedication Fund

- Anticipated revenue in next 20 years is approximately \$150 million.
- Plan will set aside money for acquisition, continue currently funded infrastructure projects and provide for major renovation of all Parks.
- The Council Approved Level of Service is 5.23 acres per 1,000.
