

SAM FALLS Artist Statemen

Artist Statement

Sam Falls (b. 1984, CA) takes nature as both his subject and material to create site-specific works that engage the viewer and the environment. Primarily working outdoors, Falls uses natural elements to collaborate directly with nature throughout his creative process. His works range from paintings employing water-reactive dyes activated by rain and mist to durational photograms harnessing sunlight and ceramics cast from plants pressed into wet clay. The specific atmosphere and ecosystem play a vital role in both the process and the final outcome of each piece.

In conjunction with the central theme of our relationship to the environment, Falls explores the symbolic power of nature to provoke reflections on our own mortality and temporal existence. His work examines the microcosm of emotional shifts linked to changing elements, as well as the broader narrative of a lifespan through the seasons—from budding blossoms to wilting petals and decay. Falls expands the definition of site-specific contexts by activating organic matter beyond its origin and preserving its silhouettes, akin to a form of fossilization or memento mori.
