Study Issue Working Title:

Making the city owned property at West Evelyn & Matilda Place open and accessible to the public with a retrofit of the existing bus terminal sign abandoned at that location.

1. What are the key elements of the issue? What precipitated this study?

The median at the corner of Matilda Place and Everyln adjacent to the Matilda overpass is over grown with redwood trees, pine needles and a dilapidate bus terminal sign that was abandoned a long time ago. The sign used to welcome visitors to downtown Sunnyvale and is part of the cities history. See attached image.


This study issue will explore ways to make use of this underused area of downtown adjacent, city owned property. The right of way lot which houses the abandoned bus terminal sign could be re-purposed as a welcome to downtown Sunnyvale sign, and this could be done by working with traffic and sign engineering.

The unused right of way parcel and unused parking lots by the former bus terminal sign could be re-purposed for additional uses, such as but are not limited to: a park, a dog run, a Frisbee golf course, a remote controlled car raceway, a food truck court. There are a variety of other uses which could be explored in this study issue.

The abandoned bus terminal sign upon re-purposing, and reuse could create a welcoming environment for this underused and now re-purposed city owned property.

2. Staff Summary of Scope and/or Comments: [Staff Use Only]

This study would look at small, City owned parcels of land in the vicinity of the Caltrain Station near Plaza Del Sol. The purpose would be to explore the possibility of developing these small parcels, including the parking lots under the Mathilda overpass, into usable space for the community. Such uses could include amenities such as mini parks, fenced dog parks, Frisbee golf course and food truck court. In addition, the Study would consider the possible replacement or refurbishment of an old Greyhound Bus sign located in the public ROW across from 100 Mathilda Place. The study would analyze City owned parcels of land near the Caltrain station for viability of use for recreational purposes. The Study will include cost estimates for proposed construction improvements and ongoing maintenance. The Study would also consider the parcel with the abandoned sign, across from 100 Mathilda Place, and ways to re-purpose the sign as a welcoming wayfinding measure and provide estimates for construction and maintenance of any improvements.
