Background

- February 2, 2024 – public comments under a Non-Agenda item regarding the negative environmental impacts of artificial turf.
 - ◆ City Council directed staff to create a policy restricting the use of artificial turf fields on City property.
- February 15, 2024 – City Council Approved Study Issue ESD 24-01 – Evaluate the Use of Artificial Turf versus Ground Cover
 - ◆ Analyze the benefits and challenges regarding the installation of artificial turf on private properties including residential and commercial landscapes and public properties.
 - ◆ The study will provide recommendations for the City to develop a policy regarding the use of artificial turf

Important Items to Consider



The Cost to remove the artificial turf from existing locations:

- Fair Oaks Park
- Magical Bridge Play Area
- Ortega Park Cricket Pitch
- Muwekma Park Play Area



The cost to replant with natural ground covering



Reduction of field time



Increased maintenance and water costs

Important Items to Consider – Fiscal Impacts

- Artificial Turf replacement qualifies for PDF
- Natural Turf maintenance does not qualify for PDF funding
- Possible Loss of Revenue from reduced field availability

Proposed New Policy

Proposal: Council Policy 3.7.3 Ban the Use of Artificial Turf in City Facilities and Open Space

POLICY PURPOSE:

This policy is to address the environmental impacts from the use of artificial turf by banning its use on all city property.

POLICY STATEMENT:

The City of Sunnyvale will not use artificial turf on any city facility for any project renovating or constructing new infrastructure where artificial turf would otherwise be considered.

Recommendation

Considerations

- **Alternative 1:**
 - ◆ Approve the proposed policy to ban the use of artificial turf on city property and direct staff to revisit the policy upon the completion of Study Issue ESD 24-01- Evaluate the Use of Artificial Turf versus Living Groundcovers.
- **Alternative 2:**
 - ◆ Do not approve the proposed policy and defer the decision pending the completion of Study Issue ESD 24-01 - Evaluate the Use of Artificial Turf versus Living Groundcovers.
- **Alternative 3:**
 - ◆ Provide other direction to staff.
