 - Approved by City Council as part of the FY24/25 Budget Adoption
 - To create a new, permanent, full-time Active Transportation Planner position

- To be responsive to Council's Strategic Priorities
 - A Sustainable City: Advancing Climate Action, Active Transportation and the Vision Zero Plan
- To accelerate the implementation of the ATP

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
