I've been paying close attention to city government for several years and have been particularly interested in the discussions surrounding the Charter Review Committee. During one City Council meeting, during discussion of a Charter-related agenda item, I double-checked the existing Charter §1005 against both the language of the Charter amendment proposed for this year's general election and the intent of the City Council regarding that Charter amendment and flagged the need to make some corrections to the Charter amendment to staff and Council, resulting in adjusted amendment language being eventually submitted to the voters. I will be a voice for making sure that our Charter is reviewed top-to-bottom to fit the current needs of the City, and also verifying that the changes we recommend will accomplish what we're trying to do.

8. What skills or attributes can you bring to the Charter Review Committee?

As a member of the Planning Commission, I've been closely reviewing documents such as conditions of approval, draft ordinance and resolutions for the last three and a quarter years. I have a good working knowledge of how the Charter is implemented in practice and how various portions of it interact with each other. Additionally, I was involved in the last major Charter change -- the move to district-based elections and a directly-elected Mayor -- and I've been observing both how we thought it would work in theory and how it's played out in practice. I also have a strong grasp of parliamentary procedure and won't have any difficulties navigating the formal requirements of the Committee.

10. Do you have ideas for changes to the City Charter that you would like to share? There's a couple things I think we need to look closely at:

- The role of the mayor as (now) the only person elected by the entire city's electorate, and how much of the mayor's de facto informal role we should be considering in the Charter -- not necessarily to codify it, but for purposes of considering compensation and whether we expect the mayor to be holding down a full-time day job or not.

- At the risk of picking at a recent scab, the vacancy provisions. The current §606 risks a June special election for a seat to be elected in November, which feels suboptimal. At the same time, right now if a Councilmember in an odd-numbered district is elected Mayor mid-term, I don't know that we'd want an appointed Councilmember for a full two years. (That scenario in general needs more discussion -- I'd also want to fill that vacancy as quickly as possible but I don't know how to require that formally given that Council doesn't certify the election until the first January meeting.)

I was invited to apply by Larry Klein and am responding to his invitation. I have long been interested in and supportive of our city government and am happy to be of service. Not so much at this time. I am coming at this, not as an advocate with a particular agenda, but to help plan the future and build consensus on the way forward. I don't have an ax to grind. As the city grows in its fixed land area, population density increases and along with it the need for housing and accessible retail, changes in city services, all of which need to be anticipated and managed.

I would like to see the voting process change so Council and Mayor are elected by a majority, not just a plurality.

The language I see on the City website for Ballot Measure F is too vague, undefined; is that what is proposed to be on the ballot? I hope not. The wording of item (1) regarding eligibility for boards and commissions (Article X) is just a goal for drafters, not Charter text, "eliminate the voter registration/citizenship requirement for members of all boards and commissions to remove barriers to volunteering." Ballot language needs to be proposed Charter language. Eligibility needs to be more inclusive, but not so broad as to allow illegal immigrants or persons with limited visas to serve, which the ballot language permits: Boards and Commissions should comprise resident citizens or legal permanent residents who are fluent in English; members should have a stake in the city, be articulate; citizen members should be registered to vote in Sunnyvale.
