Study Issue Working Title:	
Street Trees for Improved Traffic Safety	

1. What are the key elements of the issue? What precipitated this study?

Sunnyvale should explore leveraging the Parks & Rec's authority to manage street tree planting as a strategy to enhance traffic safety. A recent traffic engineering study by the city identified a correlation between street trees & calmer streets, with benefits including reduced vehicle speeds, improved pedestrian visibility, & overall safer conditions for all road users.

Street trees contribute to traffic calming by creating a sense of enclosure, which encourages drivers to reduce speed & be more attentive. The potential for traffic safety improvements is an underutilized benefit that aligns with Sunnyvale's Vision Zero goals.

This study would evaluate current street tree coverage, identify high-priority areas with traffic safety concerns, & propose a framework for integrating tree planting initiatives into traffic safety planning. Collaboration between Parks & Rec, Public Works, & Traffic Engineering to ensure tree placement aligns with visibility, accessibility, & safety standards.
