<b>SIZE</b> How many members should be on the charter review committee?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Existing standing commissions: 5 - 7</li><li>• Charter Review Comm.: 11 (Recent) up to 15</li><li>• Redistricting: 7 + 6 Alternates</li></ul>	
<b>SELECTION PROCESS</b> How should members be selected?	Council appointment process in Council Commission Policy <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• written application</li><li>• eligibility determined by City Clerk</li><li>• Interviews with full Council</li><li>• voice or paper vote at a Council meeting</li></ul>	
<b>FILLING VACANCIES</b> How should vacancies be filled?	Council appointment policy (see above)	
<b>ELIGIBILITY &amp; MEMBERSHIP</b> Should there be specific qualifications for membership?	Council Commission Policy <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 5 require Sunnyvale voter</li><li>• 5 require Sunnyvale residency</li><li>• 3 all 1 or more non-residents</li><li>• Several commissions have specific requirements.</li></ul>	
<b>RESTRICTIONS</b> Should there be restrictions on activity during and post service?	Council Commission Policy <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• No spouse, household member or relative of Council or executive staff</li><li>• Cannot serve on two commissions</li></ul>
