

Compactness, contiguity, integrity, and cohesiveness of a geographic area.




Future population growth.



- 39 responses(all were Sunnyvale residents)
- » 81% preferred a March 2020 ballot measure
- » 69% of respondents were Non-Hispanic White
- » Most respondents were 50 or older






