


It's the Law: Merge Right to Turn Right




WRONG




A frequent cause of cyclist injuries: a motorist fails to merge into the bike lane before turning right.

LEGAL

Drivers, remember the **"Three Feet for Safety Act"** when passing a bicyclist.



The safe and proper way to make a right turn: **Merge right** into the bicycle lane as you would with other standard traffic lanes, *yielding* to bicyclists and other traffic already in the lane. **Turn from the curb** rather than *across* the bicycle lane.



Optional: ONLY if it is safe to do so.

Motorists Remember: You Must **Merge** and then **Turn From the Curb!**
