

SUMMARY

As a licensed contractor and accomplished mosaics artist, I bring over 40 years of experience to the creation of captivating, nature-inspired murals and tile installations. I transform fragments of tile and glass into beautiful works of art, beautifying public spaces, educational campuses, and private residences. My work, designed with a focus on quality and community impact, enhances urban landscapes and fosters a sense of pride and connection. Through collaboration with civic leaders, developers, and architects, I help shape spaces that inspire and uplift.

PUBLIC ART INSTALLATIONS

Panda Mosaic II (2024) – *Lincoln Elementary School, Oakland, CA*

A 13' x 16' mosaic mural on the Caroline Yee Memorial Building. This outdoor panorama depicts a serene bamboo rainforest, memorializing a beloved local educator and blending Chinese and Californian cultural elements.

Five Story Butterfly Mosaic "Metamorphosis" (2023) - *Monarch Homes, Oakland, CA*

This large-scale installation features 12 monarch butterflies gracing the façade of a five-story affordable housing complex, ranging in size from 3' to 7', symbolizing transformation and hope.

Bell Tower Restoration (2021) - *Our Lady of Angels Catholic Church, Burlingame, CA*

Reconstructed a ninety-year-old mosaic on a bell-shaped cupola, replicating the original intricate design with locally sourced porcelain tiles for the Archdiocese of San Francisco.

Retaining Wall Mosaics "Soñando el Camino" (2019) - *Melrose Leadership Academy, Oakland, CA*

Created four panels covering nearly 60 feet of a 30" high retaining wall. These mosaics depict monarch butterflies and local wildflowers, celebrating the beauty of the surrounding environment.

Egrets Mosaic (2024) - *Satellite Affordable Housing Associates, Albany, CA*

Two large egrets rise from the wetlands in this 11' x 13' mosaic, transforming the exterior of an affordable housing complex into a celebration of local wildlife.

Water Fountain Mosaics "Uhai" (2020) – *Emeryville & Oakland, CA*

Mosaic surrounds the water fountains at an elementary school, depicting African wetland scenes that the honor lion school Mascot.

Trash Can Mosaics (2013-present) – *Various locations throughout Oakland, CA*

Designed over 130 mosaics for public trash cans, transforming urban spaces with abstract and nature-inspired themes. Locations include Telegraph Avenue, Lake Merritt, KONO Business District, and Chinatown.

Otter's Delight (2018) – *La Escuelita Elementary School, Oakland, CA*

A 4' x 20' outdoor mosaic featuring the school's mascot, a sea otter, which was expanded with additional panels to total 60 square feet.

Fast Friends (2018) – *Emeryville Center for Community Life, Emeryville, CA*

A 9' x 5' mosaic surrounds the school's water fountain, depicting local wetland life and its connection to the school's history.

Five Story Butterfly Mosaic (2023)- \$35,000

"Metamorphosis," a five-story mosaic on Monarch Homes, features twelve monarch butterflies ranging from 7' to 3'. It symbolizes transformation, hope, and growth, reflecting Oakland's spirit of renewal and community resilience.

Bell Tower - Our Lady of Angels Catholic Church (2021)- \$38,000

Burlingame, CA | Locally Sourced Porcelain Tiles

This mosaic restoration atop the 16' tall bell-shaped cupola replicated a 90-year-old original. It preserved the historical integrity of the 100-foot bell tower while ensuring its structural and aesthetic longevity.

Water Fountain Mosaics (2020–2021)- \$15,000

Emeryville & Oakland, CA | Ceramic Mosaic

"Uhai" at an elementary school features a 9' x 8' wetlands scene honoring the school's lion mascot. This interactive mural connects students to ecological and cultural narratives, enriching their educational environment.

Retaining Wall Mosaics (2019)- \$25,000

Oakland, CA | Glass and Ceramic Mosaic

"Soñando El Camino" spans a 60' x 34" retaining wall outside a Spanish-immersion school. The design features monarch butterflies and wildflowers, celebrating Oakland's ecological beauty and cultural diversity.

Egrets (2024)- \$35,000

Albany, CA | Glass and Ceramic Mosaic

"Egrets Rising," an 11' x 13' mosaic for an affordable housing complex, depicts two egrets soaring from wetlands. It blends themes of environmental stewardship and urban resilience.

Panda Mosaic II (2024)- \$53,000

Chinatown, Oakland, CA | Ceramic and Glass Mosaic

This 13' x 16' mural on the Caroline Yee Memorial Building features pandas in a tranquil bamboo forest. It honors Yee's legacy and celebrates Chinatown's cultural heritage.

"Venado," a 30" x 36" wall-hanging, depicts a blue deer spirit in a desert filled with peyote. This vibrant piece honors the sacred connection between nature and cultural traditions.

Chinatown Cultural Heritage Trash Cans (2015)- \$9,600



Chinatown, Oakland, CA | Glass Mosaic

This project transformed 18" x 21' planters into vibrant panels depicting the Chinese zodiac animals. The mosaics celebrate Chinatown's cultural heritage and serve as a focal point of the plaza.











Public Art Design Proposal: "Water is Life" Mosaic Bench

Project Site: Corn Palace Park – 1142 Dahlia Court, Sunnyvale, CA

Proposed Artwork Location: 64'L x 18"H seating wall

Mosaic Coverage: Approximately 40 linear feet, divided into 9 naturalistic sections

Artistic Vision:

This proposed mosaic installation, "Water is Life," draws inspiration from the rich agricultural legacy of the Corn Palace site and the essential life-giving properties of water. The piece imagines the viewer standing at the edge of a meandering stream, visually integrated into the gentle wave-like architecture of the park's low seating wall. The scene celebrates the rhythm and diversity of natural waterways, blending artistic interpretation with joyful, nature-based storytelling.

Design & Materials:

The mosaic will be composed of porcelain, shades of blue ceramic tile and with high-quality resilient mirror to reflect light like water and endure both weather and touch over time. The shimmering quality of the mirrored elements will animate the wall, creating a dynamic, ever-changing surface that mimics rippling water.

- **Dimensions:** Mosaic will span approximately 40 linear feet across the 64' seating wall, broken into 9 irregularly shaped sections that reflect the natural fragmentation of riverbanks and tidepools.
- **Form:** The wall's organic, wavy contour is echoed in the mosaic's flowing composition, enhancing the illusion of a natural waterscape nestled within the park.
- **Inlays of life:** Whimsical butterflies, frogs, blades of grass, and California poppies will punctuate the scene, offering points of color and delight for children and adults alike.
- **Transitions:** Each mosaic section will be bordered with images of boulders and river rock, creating a gentle, naturalistic transition into the negative spaces of the wall and blending harmoniously with surrounding landscaping.

Child Engagement:

The low height of the seating wall can engage young children at their eye level, making the mosaic immediately approachable. The small, nature-inspired elements serve as visual surprises, inspiring conversations, storytelling, and imaginative play. This design ensures the wall functions not just as art, but as a child-friendly experience woven into the everyday fabric of the park.

Durability & Maintenance

All materials are selected for their weather-resistance and durability, including:

- Frost- and UV-resistant porcelain and ceramic tiles
- Resilient mirrored tile rated for outdoor use
- Premium thin sets and grouts for maximum durability and longevity

The mosaic is easy to clean and graffiti resistant. The embedded design avoids protrusions, ensuring safety and longevity in a high-use public space.

Artist Qualifications

Juan Lopez, lead artist and founder of *New World Mosaics*, brings over 40 years of experience as a licensed tile contractor and public artist. His work is known for transforming public spaces through vibrant, durable, and community-centered mosaic installations. Juan holds a California contractor's license and is fully prepared to fabricate and install the mural, ensuring all aspects of the project—from materials to installation—meet high standards of craftsmanship, safety, and longevity.
