SUBJECT

Award of Bid No. PW19-04 to Suarez & Munoz Construction, Inc. for Park Irrigation and Pump Systems Rehabilitation Re-Bid and Finding of California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Categorical Exemption

REPORT IN BRIEF

Approval is requested to award a construction contract in the amount of \$380,178 to Suarez & Munoz Construction, Inc. of Hayward, for the Park Irrigation and Pump Systems Rehabilitation Re-Bid. Approval is also requested for a 10% construction contingency in the amount of \$38,018.

EXISTING POLICY

Section 1309 of the City Charter requires public works construction contracts to be awarded to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder. Further, pursuant to Section 2.09.040 of the Sunnyvale Municipal Code, City Council approval is required for public works contracts greater than \$100,000 in any one transaction.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

The proposed project is categorically exempt from environmental review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15301 as it involves the maintenance or repair of an existing facility, which includes public owned facilities, involving negligible or no expansion of use beyond which presently exists.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

This project will upgrade the existing irrigation system at Braly Park and Ponderosa Park with hydrometers, rain sensors, controller boxes and modules, valve wiring, new landscaping, and a new booster pump at Ponderosa Park. The irrigation systems at both parks perform inefficiently due to wire failure. In addition, the pump system at Ponderosa Park does not meet current safety regulations which requires replacement. This project is essential to ensure complete coverage of landscape and turf irrigation at both parks.

An Invitation for Bids for this project was initially advertised for competitive bidding on May 11, 2018, with no bids received. The common responses gathered from potential bidders demonstrated they were busy and could not take on additional projects at that time. Staff decided to wait until the peak season was over to re-advertise the project for competitive bidding.

In advance of the re-bid procurement, staff reached out to potential bidders to encourage them to participate in the bidding process. The re-bid was advertised for competitive bidding on the City's DemandStar public procurement network and distributed to Bay Area Builder's Exchanges on September 7, 2018, with six general contractors requesting bid documents. Sealed bids were opened

on October 10, 2018, with two bids received (see Attachment 1 - Bid Summary). The lowest responsive and responsible bid submitted by Suarez and Munoz Construction in the amount of \$380,178. Both bids were lower than the Engineer's Estimate of \$420,000.

FISCAL IMPACT

Funding for this project is available in Project 831570, Park Irrigation and Pump Systems Rehabilitation.

Funding Source

This project is funded in the Park Dedication Fund.

PUBLIC CONTACT

Public contact was made by posting the Council agenda on the City's official-notice bulletin board outside City Hall, at the Sunnyvale Senior Center, Community Center and Department of Public Safety; and by making the agenda and report available at the Sunnyvale Public Library, the Office of the City Clerk and on the City's website.

RECOMMENDATION

1) Make a finding of California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) categorical exemption pursuant to CEQA Guidelines 15301 as it involves the maintenance or repair of an existing public owned facility, 2) award a contract in substantially the same form as Attachment 2 to the report in the amount of \$380,178 to Suarez & Munoz Construction, Inc. and authorize the City Manager to execute the contract when all necessary conditions have been met and 3) approve a 10% construction contingency in the amount of \$38,018.

DRAFT GENERAL CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT

THIS CONTRACT dated	is by and between the CITY OF SUNNYVALE, a municipa
corporation of the State of California (("Owner") and SUAREZ & MUNOZ CONSTRUCTION, INC., a
California corporation ("Contractor").	

RECITALS:

The parties to this Contract have mutually covenanted and agreed, as follows:

1. The Contract Documents. The complete Contract consists of the following documents: Notice Inviting Bids; Instructions to Bidders; Performance Bond and Payment Bond; Guaranty; City of Sunnyvale Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction, 2006 Edition; City of Sunnyvale Standard Details for Public Works Construction, 2006 Edition; Plans and Specifications, "Park Irrigation and Pump Systems Rehabilitation RE-BID, Project No. PR-15-03, Invitation for Bids No. PW19-04", including one Addendum; OSHA, and other standards and codes as outlined in the Specifications. These documents are all incorporated by reference. The documents comprising the complete contract are collectively referred to as the Contract Documents.

Any and all obligations of the Owner and the Contractor are fully set forth and described therein.

All of the above documents are intended to work together so that any work called for in one and not mentioned in the other or vice versa is to be executed the same as if mentioned in all documents.

2. The Work. Contractor agrees to furnish all tools, equipment, apparatus, facilities, labor, transportation, and material necessary to perform and complete the project in a good and workmanlike manner. The work consist(s) of renovating and repairing pump and irrigation systems at Braly and Ponderosa Parks, as called for, and in the manner designated in, and in strict conformity with, the Plans and Specifications prepared by Verde Design and adopted by the Owner. These Plans and Specifications are entitled respectively, Park Irrigation and Pump Systems Rehabilitation RE-BID, Project No. PR-15-03.

It is understood and agreed that the work will be performed and completed as required in the Plans and Specifications under the sole direction and control of the Contractor, and subject to inspection and approval of the Owner, or its representatives. The Owner hereby designates as its representative for the purpose of this contract the Senior Civil Engineer for Construction or an employee of the Owner who will be designated in writing by the Director of Public Works.

- **3. Contract Price.** The Owner agrees to pay and the Contractor agrees to accept, in full payment for the work above agreed to be done, the sum of Three Hundred Eighty Thousand One Hundred Seventy Eight and No/100 Dlloars (\$380,178.00) subject to final determination of the work performed and materials furnished at unit prices per "Exhibit A" attached hereto and incorporated by this reference, and subject to additions and deductions in accordance, as provided in the Documents and in accordance with Contract Documents.
- **4. Permits; Compliance with Law.** Contractor shall, at its expense, obtain all necessary permits and licenses, easements, etc., for the construction of the project, give all necessary notices, pay all fees required by law, and comply with all laws, ordinances, rules and regulations relating to the work and to the preservation of the public health and safety.
- **5. Inspection by Owner.** Contractor shall at all times maintain proper facilities and provide safe access for inspection by the Owner to all parts of the work, and to the shops wherein the work is in preparation. Where the Specifications require work to be specially tested or approved, it shall not be tested or covered up without timely notice to the Owner of its readiness for inspection and without the approval thereof or consent thereto by the latter. Should any such work be covered up without such

notice, approval, or consent, it must, if required by Owner, be uncovered for examination at the Contractor's expense.

- **6. Extra or Additional Work and Changes.** Should Owner at any time during the progress of the work request any alterations, deviations, additions or omissions from the Specifications or Plans or other Contract Documents it shall be at liberty to do so, and the same shall in no way affect or make void the contract, but will be added to or deducted from the amount of the contract price, as the case may be, by a fair and reasonable valuation, agreed to in writing between the parties hereto. No extra work shall be performed or change be made unless in pursuance of a written order from the Director of Public Works or authorized representative, stating that the extra work or change is authorized and no claim for an addition to the contract sum shall be valid unless so ordered.
- **7. Time for Completion.** All work under this contract shall be completed before the expiration one hundred (100) working days from the date specified in the Notice to Proceed.

If Contractor shall be delayed in the work by the acts or neglect of Owner, or its employees or those under it by contract or otherwise, or by changes ordered in the work, or by strikes, lockouts by others, fire, unusual delay in transportation, unavoidable casualties or any causes beyond the Contractor's control, or by delay authorized by the Owner, or by any cause which the Owner shall decide to justify the delay, then the time of completion shall be extended for such reasonable time as the Owner may decide.

This provision does not exclude the recovery of damages for delay by either party under other provisions.

- **8.** Inspection and Testing of Materials. Contractor shall notify Owner a sufficient time in advance of the manufacture or production of materials, to be supplied under this contract, in order that the Owner may arrange for mill or factory inspection and testing of same, if Owner requests such notice from Contractor.
- 9. Termination. If Contractor should file a bankruptcy petition and/or be judged bankrupt, or if Contractor should make a general assignment for the benefit of creditors, or if a receiver should be appointed on account of insolvency, or if Contractor or any subcontractors should violate any of the provisions of the Contract, Owner may serve written notice upon Contractor and its surety of Owner's intention to terminate the Contract. The notice shall contain the reasons for such intention to terminate the Contract, and, unless within ten days after serving such notice, such violation shall cease and satisfactory arrangements for correction thereof be made, upon the expiration of the ten days, the Contract shall cease and terminate. In the event of any such termination, Owner shall immediately serve written notice thereof upon the surety and the Contractor, and the surety shall have the right to take over and perform the Contract; provided, however that, if the surety within fifteen days after the serving upon it of notice of termination does not give Owner written notice of its intention to take over and perform the Contract or does not commence performance thereof within thirty days from the date of the serving of such notice, Owner may take over the work and prosecute the same to completion by contract or by any other method it may deem advisable, for the account and at the expense of Contractor, and Contractor and its surety shall be liable to Owner for any excess cost occasioned Owner thereby, and in such event Owner may without liability for so doing take possession of and utilize in completing the work, such materials, appliances, plant and other property belonging to Contractor as may be on the site of the work and necessary therefor.
- 10. Owner's Right to Withhold Certain Amounts and Make Application Thereof. In addition to the amount which Owner may retain under Paragraph 21 until the final completion and acceptance of all work covered by the Contract, Owner may withhold from payment to Contractor such amount or amounts as in its judgment may be necessary to pay just claims against Contractor or any subcontractors for labor and services rendered and materials furnished in and about the work. Owner may apply such withheld amount or amounts to the payment of such claims in its discretion. In so doing Owner shall be

deemed the agent of Contractor and any payment so made by Owner shall be considered as a payment made under the Contract by Owner to the Contractor and Owner shall not be liable to Contractor for any such payment made in good faith. Such payment may be made without prior judicial determination of the claim or claims.

11. Notice and Service Thereof. All notices required pursuant to this Contract shall be communicated in writing, and shall be delivered in person, by commercial courier or by first class or priority mail delivered by the United States Postal Service. Nothing in this provision shall be construed to prohibit communication by more expedient means, such as by email or fax, to accomplish timely communication. Each party may change the address by written notice in accordance with this paragraph. Notices delivered personally shall be deemed communicated as of actual receipt; mailed notices shall be deemed communicated as of three business days after mailing. - **12. Assignment of Contract.** Neither the Contract, nor any part thereof, nor moneys due or to become due thereunder may be assigned by Contractor without the prior written approval of Owner.
- **13.** Compliance with Specifications of Materials. Whenever in the Specifications, any material or process is indicated or specified by patent or proprietary name, or by name of manufacturer, such Specifications must be met by Contractor, unless Owner agrees in writing to some other material, process or article offered by Contractor which is equal in all respects to the one specified.
- 14. Contract Security. Contractor shall furnish a surety bond in an amount at least equal to 100 percent of the contract price as security for the faithful performance of this Contract. Contractor shall also furnish a separate surety bond in an amount at least equal to 100 percent of the contract price as security for the payment of all persons for furnishing materials, provisions, provender, or other supplies, or teams, used in, upon, for or about the performance of the work contracted to be done, or for performing any work or labor thereon of any kind, and for the payment of amounts due under the Unemployment Insurance Code with respect to such work or labor in connection with this Contract, and for the payment of a reasonable attorney's fee to be fixed by the court in case suit is brought upon the bond. Bonds shall be issued by an admitted surety insurer authorized to operate in the state of California.
- 15. Insurance. Contractor shall not commence work under this Contract until all insurance required under this paragraph has been obtained and such insurance has been approved by the Owner, nor shall Contractor allow any subcontractor to commence work on a subcontract until all similar insurance required of the subcontractor has been so obtained and approved. Contractor shall furnish the Owner with satisfactory proof of the carriage of insurance required, and there shall be a specific contractual liability endorsement extending the Contractor's coverage to include the contractual liability assumed by the Contractor pursuant to this Contract and particularly Paragraph 16 hereof. Any policy of insurance required of the Contractor under this Contract shall also contain an endorsement providing that thirty (30) days' notice must be given in writing to the Owner of any pending change in the limits of liability or of any cancellation or modification of the policy. Insurance carrier shall be California-admitted.

(a) Compensation Insurance and Employer's Liability Insurance. Contractor shall take out and maintain during the life of this Contract Workers' Compensation Insurance and Employer's Liability Insurance for all of employees employed at the site of the project and, in case any work is sublet, Contractor shall require the subcontractor similarly to provide Workers' Compensation Insurance and Employer's Liability Insurance for all of the latter's employees unless such employees are covered by the protection afforded by Contractor.

In signing this Contract, Contractor makes the following certification, required by Section 1861 of the Labor Code:

"I am aware of the provision of Section 3700 of the Labor Code which requires every employer to be insured against liability for workers' compensation or to undertake self-insurance in accordance with the provisions of that code, and I will comply with such provisions before commencing the performance of the work of this contract."

(b) General and Automobile Liability Insurance. Contractor, at its own cost and expense, shall maintain personal injury liability and property damage insurance for the period covered by the Contract in the amount of Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) per occurrence and \$4,000,000 annual aggregate combined single limit coverage. Such coverage shall include, but shall not be limited to, protection against claims arising therefrom, and damage to property resulting from activities contemplated under this Contract, use of owned automobiles, products and completed operations, including U, C and X. Such insurance shall be with insurers and under forms of policies satisfactory in all respects to the Owner and shall provide that notice must be given to Owner at least thirty (30) days prior to cancellation or material change. The following endorsements shall be attached to the policy:

Policy shall cover on an "occurrence" basis. Policy must cover personal injuries as well as bodily injuries. Exclusion of contractual liability must be eliminated from personal injury endorsement. Broad form property damage endorsement must be attached. Owner is to be named as an additional insured on any contracts of insurance under this paragraph (b). Coverage shall not extend to any indemnity coverage for the active negligence of the additional insured in any case where an agreement to indemnify the additional insured would be invalid under Subdivision (b) of Section 2782 of the Civil Code. The policies of insurance shall be considered primary insurance before any policies of insurance maintained by Owner.

- 16. Indemnification and Hold Harmless. Contractor agrees to defend, save, indemnify and hold harmless Owner and all its officers, employees, and agents, against any and all liability, claims, judgments, or demands, including demands arising from injuries or death of persons (Contractor's employees included) and damage to property, arising directly or indirectly out of the obligations herein undertaken or out of the operations conducted by Contractor, save and except claims or litigation arising through the active negligence or willful misconduct of Owner, or of Owner's officials, agents, employees, servants, or independent contractors who are directly responsible to Owner. Contractor shall make good and reimburse Owner for any expenditures, including reasonable attorneys' fees, Owner may make by reason of such claim or litigation, and, if requested by Owner, Contractor shall defend any such suits at the sole cost and expense of Contractor.
- 17. Hours of Work. Eight hours of labor during any one calendar day and forty hours of labor during any one calendar week shall constitute the maximum hours of service upon all work done hereunder, and it is expressly stipulated that no laborer, worker, or mechanic employed at any time by the Contractor or by any subcontractor or subcontractors under this Contract, upon the work or upon any part of the work contemplated by this Contract, shall be required or permitted to work thereon more than eight hours during any one calendar week, except, as provided by Section 1815 of the Labor Code of the State of California, work performed by employees of contractors in excess of eight hours per day and forty hours during any one week shall be permitted upon public work upon compensation for all hours worked in excess of eight hours per day at not less than one and one-half times the basic rate

of pay. It is further expressly stipulated that for each and every violation of Sections 1811-1815, inclusive, of the Labor Code of the State of California, all the provisions whereof are deemed to be incorporated herein, Contractor shall forfeit, as a penalty to Owner, twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for each laborer, worker, or mechanic employed in the execution of this Contract by Contractor, or by any subcontractor under this Contract, for each calendar day during which the laborer, worker, or mechanic is required or permitted to work more than eight hours in any one calendar day and forty hours in any one calendar week in violation of the provisions of the Sections of the Labor Code.

Contractor, and each subcontractor, shall, in accordance with California Labor Code Section 1776 or as the same may be later amended, keep accurate payroll records showing the name, address, social security number, work classification, straight time and overtime hours worked each day and week, and the actual per diem wages paid to each journeyman, apprentice, worker, or other employee employed by him or her in connection with work under this agreement. Each payroll record shall contain or be verified by a written declaration under penalty of perjury, in accordance with Labor Code Section 1776(a). Such payroll records shall be made available at all reasonable times at the Contractor's principal office to the persons authorized to inspect such records pursuant to Labor Code Section 1776. A certified copy of all payroll records shall be made available for inspection or furnished upon request to a representative of the Division of Labor Standards Enforcement, and the Division of Apprenticeship Standards of the Department of Industrial Relations, as well as to the Owner's representative. In the event the Contractor or a Subcontractor fails to comply in a timely manner within ten days to a written notice requesting the records, such contractor or subcontractor shall forfeit one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for each calendar day, or portion thereof, for each worker, until strict compliance is effectuated, in accordance with Labor Code Section 1776(h).

18. Wage Rates. Pursuant to the Labor Code of the State of California, or any applicable local law, Owner has ascertained the general prevailing rate per diem wages and rates for holidays, and overtime work in the city, for each craft, classification or type of laborer, worker, or mechanic needed to execute this Contract. Owner has adopted, by reference, the general prevailing rate of wages applicable to the work to be done under the Contract, as adopted and published by the Division of Labor Standards Enforcement and Labor Statistics and Research of the State of California, Department of Industrial Relations, to which reference is hereby made for a full and detailed description. A copy of the prevailing wage rates may be reviewed in the office of the Director of Public Works, City of Sunnyvale, 456 West Olive Avenue, Sunnyvale, California. Wage rates can also be obtained through the California Department of Industrial Relations website at: http://www.dir.ca.gov/OPRL/DPreWageDetermination.htm

Neither the notice inviting bids nor this Contract shall constitute a representation of fact as to the prevailing wage rates upon which the Contractor or any subcontractor may base any claim against Owner.

It shall be mandatory upon Contractor and upon any subcontractor to pay not less than the specified rates to all laborers, workers, and mechanics employed in the execution of the Contract. It is further expressly stipulated that Contractor shall, as a penalty to Owner, forfeit two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for each calendar day, or portion thereof, for each laborer, worker, or mechanic paid less then the stipulated prevailing rates for any work done under this Contract by Contractor or by any subcontractor; and Contractor agrees to comply with all provisions of Section 1775 of the Labor Code.

In case it becomes necessary for Contractor or any subcontractor to employ on the project under this Contract any person in a trade or occupation (except executives, supervisory, administrative, clerical, or other non-manual workers as such) for which no minimum wage rate is herein specified, Contractor shall immediately notify Owner who will promptly thereafter determine the prevailing rate for such additional trade or occupation and shall furnish Contractor with the minimum rate based thereon. The minimum rate thus furnished shall be applicable as a minimum for such trade or occupation from the time of the initial employment of the person affected and during the continuance of such employment.

19. Accident Prevention. Precaution shall be exercised at all times for the protection of persons (including employees) and property. The safety provisions of applicable laws, building and construction codes shall be observed. Machinery, equipment, and other hazards shall be guarded or eliminated in accordance with the safety provisions of the Construction Safety Orders issued by the Industrial Accident

Commission of the State of California.

- 20. Contractor's Guarantee. Owner shall not, in any way or manner, be answerable or suffer loss, damage, expense or liability for any loss or damage that may happen to the building, work, or equipment or any part thereof, or in, on, or about the same during its construction and before acceptance. Contractor unqualifiedly guarantees the first-class quality of all workmanship and of all materials, apparatus, and equipment used or installed by Contractor or by any subcontractor or supplier in the project which is the subject of this Contract, unless a lesser quality is expressly authorized in the Plans and Specifications, in which event Contractor unqualifiedly guarantees such lesser quality; and that the work as performed by Contractor will conform with the Plans and Specifications or any written authorized deviations therefrom. In case of any defect in work, materials, apparatus or equipment, whether latent or patent, revealed to Owner within one year of the date of acceptance of completion of this Contract by Owner, Contractor will forthwith remedy such defect or defects without cost to Owner.
- 21. Liquidated Damages. Time shall be the essence of this Contract. If Contractor fails to complete, within the time fixed for such completion, the entire work mentioned and described and contracted to be done and performed, Contractor shall become liable to Owner for liquidated damages in the sum of five hundred and no/100 (\$500.00), for each and every calendar day during which work shall remain uncompleted beyond such time fixed for completion or any lawful extension thereof. The amount specified as liquidated damages is presumed to be the amount of damage sustained by Owner since it would be impracticable or extremely difficult to fix the actual damage; and the amount of liquidated damages may be deducted by Owner from moneys due Contractor hereunder, or its assigns and successors at the time of completion, and Contractor, or its assigns and successors at the time of completion, and its sureties shall be liable to Owner for any excess.
- **22. Governing Law, Jurisdiction and Venue.** This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California, without regard to conflict of law or choice of law principles. Proper venue for legal actions will be exclusively vested in a state court in the County of Santa Clara. The parties agree that subject matter and personal jurisdiction are proper in state court in the County of Santa Clara, and waive all venue objections.
- 23. Severability Clause. In case any one or more of the provisions contained herein shall, for any reason, be held invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, it shall not affect the validity of the other provisions which shall remain in full force and effect.
- **24.** Entire Agreement; Amendment. This writing constitutes the entire agreement between the parties relating to the services to be performed or materials to be furnished hereunder. No modification of this Agreement shall be effective unless and until such modification is evidenced by writing signed by all parties.
- **25. Execution and Counterparts.** This Agreement may be executed in multiple counterparts and/or with the signatures of the Parties set forth on different signature sheets and all such counterparts, when taken together, shall be deemed one original.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, two identical counterparts of this contract, each of which shall for all purposed be deemed an original thereof, have been duly executed by the parties.

REPORT TO COUNCIL

SUBJECT

Authorize the City Manager or his designee to Execute a License Agreement Between the City of Sunnyvale and TP DPE LLC for 84 Parking Stalls at the Sunnyvale Golf Course

BACKGROUND

A real estate broker representing TP DPE LLC and the Jay Paul Company approached the City with a proposal to use 84 parking stalls located at the Sunnyvale Golf Course on a temporary basis. These stalls will be used by the employees of companies located across Maude Avenue while construction is taking place at those buildings.

EXISTING POLICY

Council Policy 1.2.7 Acquisition, Leasing and Disposition of City-Owned Real Property

Section 2. Lease of City-Owned Real Property

Real property held for future use may be leased for profit when deemed appropriate and favorable to the City and in accordance with Sunnyvale Municipal Code Chapter 2.07. Property leased to outside entities should be based on the current market rent except when Council finds there is a public purpose for leasing at a lower rate.

Section 2A. Revenue from the leasing of City-owned property shall be deposited into the Fund in which the property was purchased, except when a fund no longer exists, it will be at the direction of the Awarding Authority as per Municipal Code 2.07.

Sunnyvale Municipal Code Chapter 2.07 (Purchase, Sale or Lease of Real Property) contains the following approval requirements for transactions involving Publicly Accessible Recreation and City Service (PARCS) property:

The City Council is the awarding authority for all sales or leases of PARCS property where the sales price or lease cost exceeds a total of seventy-five thousand dollars. Requires an affirmative vote of 6 Council members to approve a sale or lease of PARCS property, or to remove a property from the PARCS list.

The City Manager has awarding authority for sales or leases of PARCS property where the sales price or lease cost is seventy-five thousand dollars or less, or where the lease results in revenue to the City and is for a period of five years or less.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

Approving an agreement for parking does not constitute a "project" within the meaning of the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15378(a) as it has no potential for resulting in either a direct physical change in the environment, or a reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment. Any future development shall be subject to

the CEQA requirements.

DISCUSSION

The Sunnyvale Golf Course is one of the properties included on the PARCS list. The proposed license is for 84 parking stalls, Monday to Friday between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m., members of the public shall have the right to use any open stalls after 5:00 p.m. On Saturdays and Sundays, the parking lot in its entirety is available for public parking. With a total of 227 parking stalls on site, there is ample parking available on any week day. The licensed stalls fall on the farthest section of the parking lot from the pro shop, to avoid any inconvenience to golfers. It is anticipated that the proposed license will have very little impact on the golf course operations and customer parking.

The term of the license is for 32 months commencing on January 1, 2019 and ending on August 31, 2021 with a termination for convenience clause of 120 days written notice by either of the parties. There are three extension options, each is for two months.

An affirmative vote of 6 Council members is required to authorize the Parking Area License Agreement with TP DPE LLC as it involves a PARCS property.

FISCAL IMPACT

The License will generate a revenue of \$8,400 per month (\$100,800 per year), which will be deposited in the Golf and Tennis Operations Enterprise Fund.

PUBLIC CONTACT

Public contact was made by posting the Council agenda on the City's official-notice bulletin board outside City Hall, at the Sunnyvale Senior Center, Community Center and Department of Public Safety; and by making the agenda and report available at the Sunnyvale Public Library, the Office of the City Clerk and on the City's website. Furthermore, noticing of this public hearing was pursuant to Sunnyvale Municipal Code section 2.07.050 (b) (3):

Notice of Public Hearing · Published in the Sun newspaper not less than 15 days before the hearing (published on November 9, 2018).

Mailed notices to property owners within 4,000-foot radius of the 84 Parking stalls.

ALTERNATIVES

- 1. Authorize the City Manager or his designee to execute the Parking Area License Agreement between the City of Sunnyvale and TP DPE LLC for 84 Parking Stalls at the Sunnyvale Golf Course, effective January 1, 2019 through August 31, 2021, with three two-month extension options at \$8400 per month, in substantially the same form as Attachment 1 to the report.
- 2. Do not authorize the City Manager or his designee to execute the Parking Area License Agreement.
- 3. Provide staff direction regarding the negotiation of different terms.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Alternative 1: Authorize the City Manager or his designee to execute the Parking Area License Agreement between the City of Sunnyvale and TP DPE LLC for 84 Parking Stalls at the Sunnyvale Golf Course, effective January 1, 2019 through August 31, 2021, with three - two-month extension

options at \$8400 per month, in substantially the same form as Attachment 1 to the report. The proposed license should not create any inconvenience to golfers since it allows for parking on weekdays only; not on Saturday or Sunday, and public parking is allowed in any open space after 5:00 p.m. Also with the license area located at the end of the parking lot, at the farthest possible from the pro shop, it will not displace any of the golfers.

PARKING AREA LICENSE AGREEMENT

THIS PARKING AREA LICENSE (this "<u>License</u>"), dated as of October ___, 2018, is made by and between the City of Sunnyvale, a California municipal corporation ("<u>Licensor</u>"), and TP SPE LLC, a Delaware limited liability company ("<u>Licensee</u>").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Licensor is the landlord of a certain parcel of real estate located at 605 Macara Avenue in Sunnyvale, CA (the "<u>Property</u>") which includes, among other things, a surface parking area containing those certain eighty-four (84) parking spaces as shown on Exhibit A hereto (the "<u>Parking Area</u>");

WHEREAS, Licensor wishes to grant to Licensee, and Licensee wishes to accept an exclusive license to use the Parking Area on the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements contained herein and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, Licensor and Licensee hereby agree as follows:

1. Grant of License and Use of Parking Area.

(a) Licensor hereby grants to Licensee, and Licensee hereby accepts from Licensor, an exclusive license (the "<u>License</u>") to use the Parking Area in its "as is" condition. Licensee shall use the Parking Area for the parking of automobiles, vans, sport utility vehicles and passenger trucks owned or operated by the employees or invitees of Licensee's tenants, and for no other purpose.

2. Term

- (a) This License hereby granted shall commence on January 1, 2019, and shall continue until August 31, 2021; provided, however, that Licensee shall have the right to extend the term of this License for three (3) periods of two (2) additional months each by delivering written notice thereof to Licensor at least thirty (30) days in advance in each instance. Notwithstanding the foregoing, each party hereto shall have the option to terminate this Agreement by giving one hundred twenty (120) days prior written notice to the other unless a shorter period is mutually agreed upon by the parties, for any reason or no reason, provided that if Licensee shall be in default under any provision of this License, then Licensor may terminate this License upon ten (10) days' written notice to Licensee.
- (b) Upon the expiration or earlier termination date of the License (the "<u>Termination Date</u>"), Licensee shall, at its sole cost and expense (i) remove or cause to remove, all automobiles or other vehicles from the Parking Area and remove any signage with respect thereto from the Parking Area in accordance with the terms hereof, and pay all amounts due and owing under this License for the period up to and including the Termination Date.

3. License Fee.

- (a) <u>Fee.</u> Licensee agrees to pay to Licensor a license fee (the "<u>License Fee</u>") for the use of the Parking Area in the amount of \$8,400 monthly without deduction, set off, demand or notice.
- (b) <u>Time of Payment.</u> The License Fee shall be paid in monthly installments in advance on the first (1st) day of each month, provided that the License Fee due for the first month of the term shall be paid by Licensee to Licensor upon execution and delivery of this License.

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- 4. <u>Insurance to Be Procured and Maintained by Licensee.</u>
- (a) General and Automobile Liability Insurance. Licensee shall procure and maintain general liability and automobile insurance against claims for personal and bodily injury, death and property damage occurring on or as a result of the use of the Parking Area in the amount of \$2,000,000.00 per occurrence and \$4,000,000.00 annual aggregate ("<u>Licensee's Insurance</u>") on a claims occurrence basis in full force and effect during the term of this License, including any extensions.
- (b) The costs of procuring and maintaining Licensee's Insurance shall be borne by Licensee.
- (c) The policies identified in Section 4(a) shall name Licensor as additional insured, and shall require thirty (30) days' prior written notice to Licensor prior to any modification or expiration of any such policies or coverages.
- (d) Certificates evidencing the placing of and full payment for all insurance coverage required by this Section 4 shall be furnished by Licensee to Licensor at the time of commencement of the term of this License and at least ten (10) days prior to the renewal of the policy.

5. Licensee's Use of the Parking Area:

- (a) Licensee may use the Parking Area on Mondays through Fridays from 6:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. only. Licensee acknowledging and agreeing that after 5 pm members of the public needing to use any of the Parking Area spaces shall have the right to use any such parking spaces that are then available for use.
 - (b) Licensee shall suffer no waste or injury to the Parking Area.
- (c) Licensee shall comply with all applicable rules, laws and regulations of any governmental or quasi-governmental authority applicable to the manner of use of the Parking Area, including, without limitation, building and/or zoning codes, and shall comply with all reasonable rules and regulations (the "Rules and Regulations") Licensor may, at any time or from time to time, establish regarding the Parking Area therein.
- (d) Licensee shall not interfere in any with any of Landlord's tenant(s) or other permittees' use of those portions of the parking lot not included in the Parking Area.
- (e) Licensee shall not create or permit to be created any lien, encumbrance or charge on the Parking Area.
- (f) Licensee shall not wash, polish and/or clean, or permit others to wash, polish, and/or clean automobiles and other vehicles in the Parking Area.
- (g) Licensee shall not store any items in, on, or about the Parking Area, nor shall Licensee dispose of any flammable, explosive, radioactive, hazardous, toxic, contaminating, polluting matter, waste, or substance or related injurious materials in, under, about, or on any part of the Parking Area whatsoever.
- (h) Licensee acknowledges and agrees that Licensee shall be solely responsible for any theft, vandalism, or other damage or destruction to any automobiles or other vehicles parked in the Parking Area. Licensor shall suffer no liability for any purported lack of security to the Parking Area, nor shall Licensor be responsible for any damages or expenses arising from such acts.
- (i) Licensee acknowledges and agrees that Licensee shall have the right to implement a valet service at the Parking Area at Licensee's sole expense, which valet service shall include the use of shuttle buses to and from the Parking Area in order to bring the employees and invitees of Licensee's tenants to and from the Parking Area.

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- (j) Licensee shall be responsible, at Licensee's expense, for the installation of any legally-required signage necessary for the use of the Parking Area.
- (k) Licensor and Licensee may relocate the parking spaces within the Parking Area upon prior written approval of both parties.
- 6. <u>Obligations of Licensor</u>. Licensee acknowledges that Licensor has not made any representations, warranties, promises or agreements to improve or alter the Parking Area. During the term of this License, Licensor shall, at Licensor's expense:
 - (a) perform all maintenance and repairs necessary in order for the Parking Area to be in a condition necessary for Licensee's use of the Parking Area for the purposes described I this Agreement;
 - (b) ensure that utility services and other similar services are available to the Parking Area as Licensor deems reasonably necessary.
 - (c) Licensor shall have no responsibility or liability to Licensee for failure to perform any of the foregoing obligations for reasons outside its reasonable control, and such failure shall never be deemed to constitute an eviction or disturbance of the Licensee's use and possession of the Parking Area or relieve Licensee from paying the License Fee or performing any of its obligations under this License.
- 7. <u>Alterations:</u> Licensee shall not make or perform any alterations, installations, additions or other physical changes to the Parking Area.
- 8. <u>Indemnification and Hold Harmless:</u> Licensee agrees to indemnify, defend and hold Licensor harmless from and against any and all loss, liability, damage, cost and expense, including, without limitation, reasonable attorneys' fees and disbursements, arising from or claimed to arise as a result of any act, omission, neglect or failure to act of Licensee or any persons entering the Parking Area with Licensee's permission.
- 9. <u>Destruction or Damage.</u> If the Parking Area or the access thereto shall be partially damaged at no fault of Licensee, the same shall be repaired and the Parking Area restored at Licensor's option to its condition prior to the damage, as nearly as may be, by and at the expense of Licensor with reasonable diligence. Until such repairs shall be made, the License Fee shall be apportioned according to the part of the Parking Area which is usable by Licensee for the normal operation of its business. Licensor shall not be liable to Licensee for reasonable delay which may arise by reason of strikes or other labor troubles, weather or physical conditions or any other cause beyond Licensor's control. If, in Licensor's determination made within thirty (30) days after the date of the damage, the repairs cannot be performed within sixty (60) days after the date of the date of the casualty, either Licensor or Licensee shall have the right to terminate this License upon twenty (20) days' prior written notice to the other. Any destruction or damage to the Parking Area or surrounding area caused by the Licensee shall be repaired to its condition immediately prior to such destruction or damage.
- 10. <u>No Personal Liability of Licensor</u>. Any liability of Licensor under this License shall be limited to its interest in the Parking Area, and in no event shall any personal liability be asserted against Licensor, its employees, officers, agents, shareholders, parties, directors, advisors, representatives, successors or assigns in connection with this License. Licensor shall not be liable to Licensee for any injury or damage to Licensee or to any other person or for any damage to, or loss (by theft or otherwise) of, any property of Licensee or of any other person, irrespective of the cause of such injury, damage or loss.
- 11. <u>Notice of Accidents, Fire, Damage and Defects.</u> Licensee shall give prompt notice to Licensor of any of the following of which Licensee shall have knowledge:
 - (a) any accident in or about the Parking Area;

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- (b) all fires or other casualties in the Parking Area; and
- (c) all damage to or defects in the Parking Area;
- (d) any theft or vandalism occurring in or about the Parking Area or any vehicle parked therein.
- 12. <u>Notices</u>. Any notice, consent, demand, or other communication required or permitted to be given under this License shall be in writing, shall be sent by (i) overnight courier for next-business-morning delivery; (ii) by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, or (iii) by personal delivery, to the parties at the following addresses (or to such other or further addresses as the parties may designate by like notices similarly sent), and shall be deemed given and received for all purposes three (3) business days after the date deposited in the United States mail if sent by registered or certified mail, or the date of delivery if sent by courier or personal delivery, except that a notice of a change in address shall be effective only upon receipt:

- 13. <u>No Lease:</u> This Agreement does not and shall not be deemed to constitute a lease or a conveyance of the Parking Area by Licensor to Licensee or to confer upon Licensee any right, title, estate or interest in or to the Parking Area other than the license described herein. This Agreement grants to Licensee only a personal privilege to use and occupy the Parking Area for the term hereof on the terms and conditions set forth herein.

- (g) Neither this License nor any memorandum thereof may be recorded or filed in the Santa Clara County Recorder without the prior written consent of Licensor.

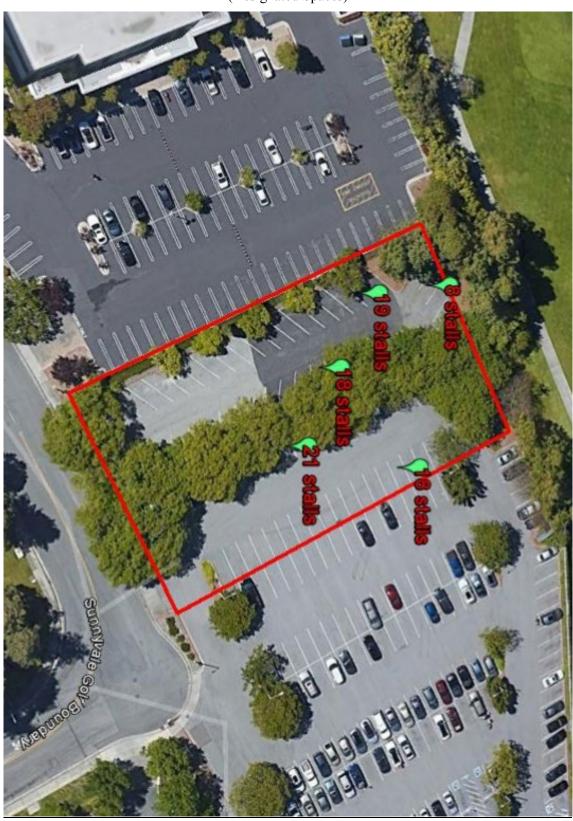

REPORT TO CITY COUNCIL

SUBJECT

Biennial Review of Priority Needs for Human Services

BACKGROUND

The City provides grants to eligible human services agencies on a competitive basis pursuant to Council Policy 5.1.3: *Human Services*, originally adopted in 1981, and amended in 1999 and 2006. Eligible human service agencies are those which provide assistance programs for lower-income clients (those with a household income of less than 80% of area median income), such as food, legal services, health care, literacy classes, child care, and so on. Most of the clients served by these programs are seniors, people with disabilities, very low income households, and homeless persons. Historically the City has used a portion of its annual Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) from the federal government to fund these grants, although in more recent years, City General funds have also been used.

Applications for the human services grants are solicited every two years, following hearings held by the Housing and Human Services Commission (HHSC) and City Council to determine the City's current "priority human service needs." Grants are awarded conditionally for a two-year period, with the second-year grants conditioned on several factors, such as successful completion of the grant activity in the first year, compliance with the terms of the grant agreement, and availability of funding for the second year.

The priority needs are those identified through this hearing process as most deserving of the City's funds designated for human services. The total amount of funding requested usually exceeds the amount available by a factor of two or more. It is therefore helpful for applicants to know the priorities so that they better determine if their programs are likely to succeed in receiving a grant through the City's grant program. This program is quite competitive and, typically, not all grant applicants will be funded. Programs that address needs other than the identified priority needs are not excluded from this grant program, although proposals addressing one or more of the priority needs will be awarded more points in the "need" category than those addressing non-priority needs.

After the list of priority needs has been recommended by the HHSC and approved by City Council, staff will issue a request for proposals (RFP) for human services programs serving the priority needs, and will begin reviewing proposals in early 2019. The HHSC will have an opportunity to review and comment on the draft RFP before it is published. After proposals are reviewed by staff for eligibility and issued technical scores by the staff scoring committee, the HHSC will hold several public hearings to evaluate the eligible proposals and recommend grant awards to City Council. City Council will consider the recommended grant amounts and make final funding decisions in May 2019.

In addition to determining the priority needs, City Council has also established a practice of determining the amount of General Funds to be provided for human services grants to supplement the CDBG funds. This is known as supplemental funding, and this process is described further in the Discussion section of this report.

EXISTING POLICY

Human Services Policy 5.1.3

The City will biennially, prior to adoption of the two-year Resource Allocation Plan, review prevailing conditions of human needs within the City and give appropriate attention to Human Services Policies in the City. The Housing and Human Services Commission, following one or more public hearings, will recommend to City Council priority human service needs for the next two years. Following a public hearing, City Council will adopt a two-year priority of human service needs.

The City seeks to meet as many Human Service needs as possible using its limited available resources. The primary resource utilized for funding human services is the Federal Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) which permits up to 15% of the annual grant entitlement to be utilized for such purposes. The City Council may choose to supplement CDBG funding of human services through the annual budget process.

2015-2020 HUD Consolidated Plan

Goal C, Action 1: Support provision of essential human services, particularly for special needs populations.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

The action being considered does not constitute a "project" with the meaning of the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15378 (b) (4) in that it is a fiscal activity that does not involve any commitment to any specific project which may result in a potential significant impact on the environment.

DISCUSSION

Part 1. Determining Priority Needs

The use of CDBG funds, which comprised about 67% of the funding for human services grants in the last two-year cycle (2017 and 2018), must be consistent with the City's 2015-2020 Consolidated Plan (ConPlan), a five-year strategic plan that the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) requires the City to prepare as a condition of receiving the CDBG grant. The ConPlan includes the following list of priority needs for human services and prioritized client types:

Priority Client Types

Very low-income, extremely low-income, and/or special needs households (e.g., seniors, disabled, homeless persons, children, youth, victims of domestic violence, etc.).

Priority Needs (Service Types)

- A. Basic needs (e.g., food, shelter, transportation, health & mental health care, employment assistance/training, child care, etc.).
- B. After school or intervention programs to provide youth with positive alternatives to drugs, violence, and/or gangs (e.g., recreational, mentoring, educational, and career-building activities).

C. Mental health, addiction and substance abuse counseling, particularly for youth and those exiting institutions.

D. Other specialized supportive services as may be requested by the community, such as foreclosure assistance, legal assistance for seniors and others, and other specialized human services, such as those currently supported by the City, or those that may address a new or unmet priority need.

At the last priority needs hearings, held in late 2016, the HHSC and Council reaffirmed the above list of priority needs, consistent with the ConPlan. The ConPlan is a five-year plan the City prepares to remain eligible for two annual federal grants: the CDBG and HOME grants, which provide a total of about \$1.2 million annually to the City; much of which is passed through to local non-profits. The ConPlan describes various affordable housing, human services, and community development activities the City plans to design and fund with these two grants over the five-year period.

One purpose of the current hearings is to determine whether this list of priority needs should continue to be implemented for the next two-year funding cycle, or if it should be modified or updated in any way prior to solicitation of proposals. Another purpose of the hearings is to provide City Council an opportunity to indicate how much General Fund monies to target for human services funding in the upcoming fiscal year ("supplemental funding"), either \$100,000, as shown in the current Projects Budget and annually in the 20-year Resource Allocation Plan, or a different amount.

HUD recognizes that the priority needs may change periodically during the 5-year term of the ConPlan; therefore, the biennial hearing allows an opportunity for the public and local officials to make adjustments to the list of priorities if needed to reflect evolving local circumstances. This hearing also allows the public an opportunity to raise any issues that may be relevant to the process of allocating the City's available CDBG funds in the coming two years.

Part 2. Determining Supplemental Funding Amount

The second purpose of this hearing is to determine the General Fund supplemental funding amount for the coming year, in accordance with past Council direction. As noted above, for many years Sunnyvale has provided funding for the human services grants using CDBG and General Funds (supplemental funds). Approximately one-third of the funding for the grants has come from the City's General Fund in recent years, following Council direction in prior years to include a planned expenditure of \$100,000 annually for human services grants for each of the next twenty years in the Resource Allocation Plan. Council confirms this appropriation annually when adopting the City budget each June, and has an opportunity to affirm or modify the amount planned for the coming year during the biennial priority needs hearings. In the last two-year funding cycle, for fiscal years 2017/18 and 2018/19, Council approved \$100,000 in funding for each of the two years. The amount of supplemental and CDBG funds provided for this program in the past five fiscal years, and a five-year average of each, is shown in Attachment 1.

It is important to emphasize that the supplemental funding amount recommended at this time is used for planning purposes only, and does not constitute a budget appropriation of any kind. Staff uses the recommended amount approved by City Council in November to indicate in the RFP how much funding of each type (CDBG or General Funds) is estimated to be available for human services grants in the coming year. The RFP emphasizes that these amounts are just estimates, and could change by the time the City budget is adopted in June, and that any grant award recommendations

are contingent on the amount of funding ultimately appropriated by Congress (for the CDBG funds) and City Council (for the General Funds).

The amount of supplemental funding indicated in the Resource Allocation Plan (RAP) for FY 2019/20 and subsequent years is \$100,000, however this figure is just an estimate used for long-range planning purposes, and the formal appropriation, which could be higher or lower than this amount based on fiscal conditions at the time of the budget hearings, does not occur until the budget for each fiscal year is adopted in June of each year.

During the October 24, 2018 meeting of the HHSC, Commissioners discussed and voted to recommend an increase to the amount budgeted for human services to \$200,000 (Report No. 18-0892). The Commission requested staff to retrieve information on changes in specified economic indicators over the past decade to justify this increase, and to include this information with the HHSC recommendation.

Staff collected data on: changes in inflation, housing cost, number of lower-income households, and general fund budgeted expenditures over the past decade. The data was presented to the HHSC at a special meeting on November 14, 2018 (Report No. 18-1009). Three letters were submitted to the HHSC prior to the November 2018 meeting (included in Attachment 2). Four members of the public spoke on this item. A representative of Sunnyvale Community Services (SCS) spoke to her letter and data on SCS activity over 10 years. The HHSC confirmed their intent to recommend an increase to \$200,000 in the general fund supplement for FY 2019/20 and clarified that all of the data collected by staff and provided by Sunnyvale Community Services jointly support their recommendation to increase the supplemental funding.

Minutes of the October 24, 2018 HHSC meeting are in Attachment 3 and Draft minutes of the November 14, 2018 meeting are in Attachment 4. As requested by the HHSC Attachment 5 combines the Summary of Economic data collected by staff and the information provided by Sunnyvale Community Services.

FISCAL IMPACT

The recommended alternative for supplemental human services funding is \$125,000, an increase for FY 2019/20 over the current Adopted Budget and 20-year Resource Allocation Plan. The following table illustrates fiscal impacts comparing the adopted RAP, staff recommendation, and Human Services Commission recommendation.

The recommended actions are for planning purposes only, to allow staff to solicit funding proposals,

while formal appropriations for fiscal year 2019/20 will be presented in the FY 2019/20 Recommended Budget for City Council consideration.

PUBLIC CONTACT

Public contact was made by posting the Council agenda on the City's official-notice bulletin board outside City Hall, at the Sunnyvale Senior Center, Community Center and Department of Public Safety; and by making the agenda and report available at the Sunnyvale Public Library, the Office of the City Clerk and on the City's website.

Five members of the public, each representing human services agencies, spoke at the HHSC hearing on this item on October 24, 2018. They each thanked the City for its past support and explained why their programs continue to meet priority needs in the community. Four members of the public spoke at the November 14, 2018 HHSC meeting. Public Comment Letters are provided in Attachment 2.

ALTERNATIVES

- 1. Approve the list of priority needs as shown in the staff report, excerpted from the 2015-2020 Consolidated Plan.
- 2. Approve the list of priority needs shown above, with modifications.
- 3. Select a preliminary budget for supplemental funding amount of \$125,000 for human services grants for FY 2019/20.
- 4. Select a preliminary budget for supplemental funding amount of \$200,000 for human services grants for FY 2019/20 (HHSC recommendation).
- 5. Select a different supplemental funding amount for human services grants for FY 2019/20.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Alternatives 1 and 3: 1) Approve the list of priority needs as shown in the staff report, excerpted from the 2015-2020 Consolidated Plan; and, 3) Select a preliminary budget for supplemental funding amount of \$125,000 for human services grants for FY 2019/20.

The current list of priority needs is broad enough to encompass virtually all types of human services; therefore, modification of the list does not appear to be necessary. However, if members of the public or the commission feel otherwise, modifications can be made.

Staff is recommending an increase to the supplemental funding for human services grants. The increase to \$125,000 acknowledges the economic changes since 2007; the recommendation was derived by applying the percent of total general fund budgeted expenditures in 2007 (0.067553%) to the total general fund budgeted expenditures for FY 2018/19. This budget recommendation is for planning purposes only as the final general fund budget for supplemental human services grants will be determined by City Council with the approval of the budget and the supplemental grants.

Dear Mr. Shin,

Senior Adults Legal Assistance (SALA) submits these comments for the public hearing on October 24 before the Housing and Human Services Commission regarding the Biannual Review of Priority Needs for Human Services in Sunnyvale. We request that our letter be distributed to the Commission and that these written comments become part of the hearing record.

We understand the Commission is interested in receiving input on priority needs that will be included in the applications for Human Service Grants for fiscal years 2019-2020 and 2020-2021. The need for Legal Assistance for Sunnyvale seniors, particularly individuals and couples that are low income and at-risk, is one such area of priority need...

This priority need is currently identified in Sunnyvale's 2015-2020 Consolidated Plan (CON Plan) as objective D and is referenced in the staff memo (18-0892) on page 3 as follows:

"D. Other specialized supportive services as may be requested by the community, such as ... legal assistance for seniors ..." [Emphasis added].

SALA is currently receiving Human Service Grant support from Sunnyvale for our Legal Assistance to Seniors project targeting low income and/or at risk Sunnyvale clients because our program aligns with this CON Plan priority.

We hope that our comments will confirm that specialized supportive services for seniors, and in particular Legal Assistance for lower income and/or at risk seniors, continue to be high priority and unmet human service needs for Sunnyvale, especially in light of the fact that seniors are the fastest growing segment of the population and funding for senior services has not kept up with this growth.

The remainder of this letter documents the need for Legal Assistance for seniors and provides information about the legal services SALA provided to Sunnyvale residents in FY 2017-18. That information will also demonstrate that legal issues are often imbedded in many areas of service essential to the elder population's daily survival.

THE NEED FOR LEGAL ASSISTANCE FOR SENIORS

We preface this section by noting that Legal Assistance is a service that provides support to elders across numerous fields of human service, so the need for this service tends to be under-reported and under-ranked as a priority when funders conduct needs assessments.

For the foregoing reason, our comments are limited to the need for Legal Assistance by elders. The limitation of our comments to this need area should not be construed as our position regarding the relative merits of any other human service needs in Sunnyvale or as an indication that we believe that they are not important needs as well.

A. Documentation of Need from Local Needs Assessments

Needs reports prepared by the Area Agency on Aging (AAA), formerly Council on Aging and now known as Sourcewise) and by the County of Santa Clara provide documentation of the critical need for accessible and affordable legal services for local elders, in particular for those seniors that are low income or at risk (SALA's target population), to keep them independent and to prevent their abuse, conservatorship, or premature institutionalization.

The AAA's <u>Area Plan for 2009-2012</u> notes that legal assistance is a priority need "to help older persons to obtain services and benefits including protective services for financial abuse, competence and conservatorship". The AAA's <u>Area Plan for 2012-16</u> affirms that legal services are a priority service and notes such services "are crucial in helping keep seniors in their homes" and "are absolutely vital to those in need of them." The most recent <u>Area Plan for 2016-2020</u> further affirms that legal assistance continues to be "priority service" for seniors in Santa Clara County.

<u>Unmet Civil Legal Needs of Indigent Residents of Santa Clara County</u>, a report prepared for the Santa Clara County Board of Supervisors in August 2001, confirms the findings above and notes: "legal representation and counsel can be essential to the elderly and their families in gaining access to health, income, and social services." More recently the <u>Santa Clara County Seniors' Agenda: A Quality of Life Assessment</u>, prepared for the Board of Supervisors in April 2012, identifies legal assistance and elder abuse prevention as key service/safety net needs, noting SALA "is the only non-profit elder law office in the county focused on the legal needs of seniors" and that SALA's target population includes "seniors who are most likely at risk for abuse, exploitation, and institutionalization".

The <u>Senior's Agenda</u> further states that one of the big challenges to providing free legal services to seniors are the drastic reductions in funding that have taken place and have increased over the last several years, noting that two major consequences of reduced funding are an increase in the waiting lists and a decrease in the number of clients to be served. Significantly, waiting times for SALA appointments at many of our agency's community-based sites average a minimum of 2 months.

The AAA's <u>Area Plan for 2016-2020</u> notes that persons age 65+ will comprise 25% of the Santa Clara County population by 2060 as compared to 17% today and 12% in 2010. The need for supportive services for seniors, including legal services, will continue to grow along with this dramatic demographic shift toward an older population.

We believe the sources above document that Legal Assistance continues to be a need that is critical to the lives and well being of Sunnyvale seniors, particularly those that are at-risk and/or low-income. We also believe this documentation supports the conclusion that Legal Assistance is a key access service for seniors and their families or caregivers. These reports could also support the interpretation that Legal Assistance is the most critical of access services because, as a provider of last resort,

Legal Assistance is necessary to enforce elders' rights to services and public benefits after preliminary access has been denied. These needs reports also identify the linkage between Legal Assistance and Protective Services (including prevention of elder abuse and conservatorship), yet another factor that should support the ranking of Legal Assistance as a critical service need.

B. Documentation of Need from SALA

Founded in1973, SALA is the only legal aid agency in Santa Clara County designated by the AAA, Sourcewise, to provide free Legal Assistance exclusively to elders under the Older Americans Act. SALA is also the only provider of free legal services with a physical presence in Sunnyvale, making our services accessible locally to Sunnyvale seniors. Specifically, SALA currently provides services at least twice monthly in donated space at the offices of Sunnyvale Community Services.

Consistent with the mandate of the Older Americans Act, SALA targets our legal services to elders countywide and in Sunnyvale who have low incomes, are frail, or are at-risk of abuse, isolation or institutionalization. Due to their low-income status, many of SALA's target clients are underserved because they struggle to provide for their basic needs (food, medical, housing, transportation) and cannot pay a private attorney \$400 to \$500 an hour. Our target clientele is also at higher risk (in Greater Social Need) due to characteristics (age 75/+ or disabled) many exhibit that are cited below.

Statistics for SALA clients from Sunnyvale provide support for the assessment that Legal Assistance is critical to the lives and well being of the most vulnerable and at-risk elders in Sunnyvale. Specifically, most of the Sunnyvale seniors receiving legal services from SALA in 2017-18 had characteristics that put them in great economic need or at some level of being "at risk" of abuse, isolation, conservatorship, or premature institutionalization as noted below:

- 45% were extremely low income (incomes at or below 30% of the county median)
- An additional 21% were very low income (incomes at or below 50% of the county median).
- 47% were age 75 or older (placing them at higher risk according to the Older Americans Act)
- 30% had a disability (placing them at higher risk according to the Older Americans Act).

In addition, 63% of the Sunnyvale seniors served were female and 45% self-identified as minority elders. We believe that these statistics for SALA clients also align with the Priority Client Types noted in the 2015-2020 CON Plan and in the staff memo on page 2, specifically very low-income, extremely low-income and/or other special needs populations (e.g., seniors, disabled ...) [Emphasis added]

The critical role SALA plays in the lives of elders countywide, and in Sunnyvale, is also illustrated by the types of legal problems for which they request our assistance. These requests address a broad spectrum of legal issues including: (1) **Housing** (landlord-tenant and fair housing/reasonable accommodation matters) and **Public Benefits** (Social Security, SSI, Medicare, Medi-Cal, In Home Supportive Services) to meet their **Basic Needs**; (2) **Elder Abuse and Domestic Violence Prevention** (through court issued Restraining Orders or other interventions); and (3) **Legal Planning for Incapacity/End Stages of Life** to maintain their independence, prevent conservatorship, and support Aging in Place.

We close this section by noting that the increasing need for Legal Assistance for seniors over the past decade has created a demand that far exceeds the existing service levels of SALA, the sole provider of such services locally. Moreover, funding for SALA's services has not keep up with the demand, creating waiting times for an appointment with SALA at many of our 15+ appointment

locations through the County that now average two months. The <u>Santa Clara County Senior Agenda</u> report notes that this will only get worse: "The coming "age wave" will increase the demand for these [legal] services and currently service providers are fighting for their own survival while attempting to advocate for seniors"

SUMMARY

We believe that we have demonstrated that Legal Assistance continues to be a need that is critical to the lives and well being of elders in Sunnyvale, particularly those that are low income or at risk. The importance of Legal Assistance in the area of Incapacity/End of Life Planning and Elder Abuse is also documented, as is the role of Legal Assistance as a "safety net" service and key access service to ensure elders' adequate income, housing, basic necessities, safety, and independence.

Lastly we hope that we have demonstrated that Legal Assistance to Sunnyvale elders as provided by SALA align with the Priority Client Types (*very low income, extremely low income and/or other special needs populations including seniors*) and with Priority Needs (*other specialized supportive services as may be requested by the community, such as ...legal assistance for seniors*) set forth in the current Sunnyvale <u>CON Plan</u>.

The City of Sunnyvale staff is recommending **Alternative #1** that reaffirms the current list of priority needs from the <u>2015-2020 CON Plan</u>, which they excerpted on pages 2 and 3 of their memo. We encourage the Commission to support this recommendation.

We also hope that the Commission will support **Alternative #3** recommended by the staff to set aside \$100,000 in supplemental funding for Human Service Grants for FY 2019/20, which in the past has supported funding for projects such as SALA's Legal Assistance to Elders.

Good evening, thank you for the opportunity to tell you about the LTC Ombudsman Program at Catholic Charities of Santa Clara County, also to thank the **City of Sunnyvale** for your *past* and *continued* support of the Ombudsman Program.

The Ombudsman is the **Advocate** for the most **vulnerable citizens of your city** – those who live in Nursing Homes and Assisted Living Facilities. We advocate for the dignity, rights and needs of seniors and disabled in those facilities.

This is an **unduplicated service** in Santa Clara County – no other program has **24/7 access** to residents in facilities. All are required by law to have our posters (phone number in large type) in their facilities.

The Program is authorized by the federal Older Americans Act, as well as the California Older Californian Act to advocate for the rights of seniors and disabled residents in long term care facilities. The main function of the Ombudsman Program is to investigate and to resolve complaints made by or on behalf of residents related to issues of quality of care and abuse.

In essence the program protects and helps improve the **quality of care and quality of life** for the frailest of our senior and disabled population.

Living in a long term care facility is often not the first choice for anyone. Many seniors and disabled adults have *no* option but to live in a facility and for this reason it is very important that their rights are protected. The presence of LTC Ombudsmen in itself improves quality of care and life of all residents by giving a voice to those seniors and providing an advocate for their needs and concerns.

We investigate **ELDER ABUSE**, complaints, solve problems, mediate, give referrals and witness Advance Health Care Directives... all our services are **FREE** to residents and their family/friends.

We partner with other agencies ie. Silicon Valley Independent Living Center, SALA, Next Door Solutions, Police and Sherriff Departments, Adult Protective Services, and Licensing for the facilities, to name a few.

Actual Sunnyvale facilities and residents:

- 4 Nursing Homes + 28 RCFEs (Assisted Living Facilities + 6-Bed Board & Care) = Total 31 facilities
- 1,125 residents in Sunnyvale facilities
- City of Sunnyvale: **1 Staff + 5 volunteers** (last year our volunteer contributed 5,295 hours throughout Santa Clara County)

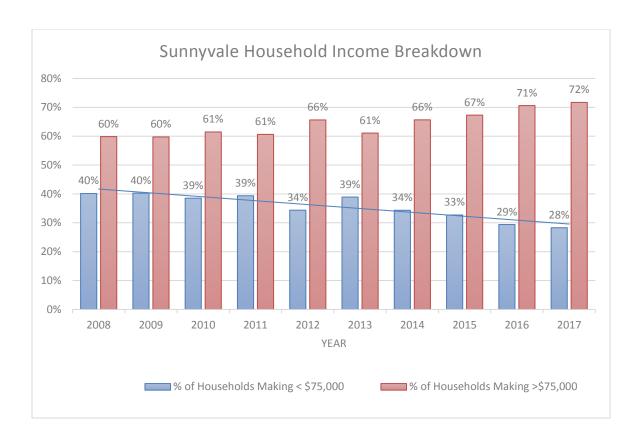
