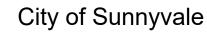

-Staff Comments

Director Bojorquez informed the Board of the following:

- The Council Subcommittee on Board/Commission Bylaws will be meeting on Tuesday, December 11 at 4:00 p.m. in the West Conference Room. The Subcommittee will be reviewing the Board and Commission Bylaws and the feedback received from the Study Session to make recommendations for Council action.

- The California Department of Motor Vehicles has installed an automated kiosk at Santa Clara's Central Park Branch Library. The kiosk allows drivers to renew their registration instantly, allowing users to print out their new tags immediately.

- The Library and Community Services Department will be coordinating a Guinness World record attempt for "Most People Balancing Books on their Heads" on Saturday, June 8, 2019 at Fremont High School. The current record was set in November 2012 with 998 people balancing books on their heads. To break the current record, participants will need to simultaneously balance a book on their head while walking 16.4 feet at a single venue.

- Loudoun County Public Library recently opened their tenth library, Brambleton Library. A presentation highlighting Brambleton Library and the grand opening celebration was presented.

- The Board proposed Study Issue: Options and Benefits of Establishing a Library Foundation has been submitted for approval.

SCOPE OF THE STUDY

What precipitated this study?

Since 1965, the Friends of the Sunnyvale Public Library, a 501(c)3 non-profit organization, has provided generous donations to support library services through a longstanding relationship with the City. When Council approved construction of a new branch library at Lakewood Park, the Friends recognized a need to focus public attention on library services, facilities and needs and stimulate monetary donations through fundraising, endowments, and bequests. In 2014, the Friends formed a sub-committee to achieve this goal. The sub-committee was conceived as a mechanism by which a library foundation could grow out of and be legally created, and structuring it in this way was consistent with the mission and bylaws of the Friends. However, the sub-committee has thus far been unable to attract the key stakeholders that would be needed to organize an effective fundraising effort. For this reason, the Board of Library Trustees suggested a study by staff to raise awareness of the options and benefits of establishing a library foundation for the City and its residents.

What are the key elements of the study?

The study issue would describe the benefits of a library foundation, research the different models for establishing a library foundation, and organize a forum of experts to share best practices. The research would include legal structures, state requirements, federal tax-exempt requirements, ongoing recordkeeping requirements, activities that could jeopardize status, effective fundraising strategies, and relationships with stakeholders, including City staff and the City Council. The forum would be open to the public, include speakers from neighboring jurisdictions operating successful foundations, and feature best practice information on topics such as fundraising, community engagement, operational effectiveness, and volunteer recruitment and retention.

Estimated years to complete study: 6 months

The Study would require moderate staff time from the Department of Library and Community Services to conduct policy research and analysis on the Study. Staff time would also be required from the Office of the City Manager and Office of the City Attorney to review and advise on results of research.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Support. This policy issue merits discussion at the 2019 Study Issues Workshop.

Maintaining appropriate library facilities based on changing community needs is Goal CC-7 of the General Plan. In November 2013, Council approved the construction of a new branch library facility, and in September 2018, Council approved the Civic Center Modernization Master Plan which includes a new main library facility. A library foundation could play an important role in supporting these capital projects. The proposed study issue would provide a valuable tool to raise the awareness of the options and benefits of a library foundation for the City and its residents.
