### **PUBLIC HEARINGS/GENERAL BUSINESS**

20-0080 Rank 2020 Study Issues

Chair Kenton shared the titles of the five proposed study issues to be ranked and opened the floor for any commissioner questions to staff.

Commissioners inquired and Superintendent Stark responded:

- Regarding DPW 20-03, what is the latest situation at Parks and how does this issue relate? Staff described the proposed study issue concept and noted areas that may be addressed during the study.
- What about dumping at Parks? Staff replied regarding dumping at Parks.
- Will consultants provide public outreach meetings? Staff inquired on which item was being addressed and replied that for the outdoor facilities Study Issue (LCS 20-03), a public outreach meeting would most likely be held.
