




Single Family Average Price History




Number of Single Family Full Value Sales




Property Tax Revenue Growth History

Transient Occupancy Tax Historical





Utility Users Tax Historical











FY 2020/21 Recommended Budget

Overall budget approach:

- Position the City for economic volatility
- Maintain a balanced budget for 20 years
- Continue to be cautious and thoughtful with revenue projections
- Manage operating and capital cost escalations
- Identify uses for Service Level Set Aside

FY 2019/20 Recommended Budget

- Focus on Operating Budget
- Currently evaluating operating expenditures and major expenditure assumptions
- City Manager reviewing and evaluating base and adjusted budgets – hold on new additions
- Budget Workshop End of May
- Public Hearing and Budget Adoption in June
