Thanks so much for sending this. It is great to see that they are taking an aesthetic approach to a security fence instead of chain link and razor wire.

My concerns are that since the fence makes the Victory Village neighborhood invisible to the company and its staff, that they forget we are here. The site in question has been a constant source of noise and light pollution. When Maxim was the tenant, I had the number of the facility supervisor and I could call him directly if I had any concerns over the noise or lights. He was very responsive and took my suggestions very seriously. They worked hard to be a good neighbor.

The past couple of years, the site has been an ongoing construction zone and the noise has greatly impacted my life. I had no other recourse at times but to call Public Safety or send a complaint through the City of Sunnyvale website.

Please let the new tenant know that their staff should be respectful of the neighborhood. If possible plan to have the noise producing activities face Wolfe where no on lives. Also use down lights if they want to light their area and not burden us with even more light pollution then we have now. Is is possible to not have the leaf blowers every Friday night at 8:00 pm? Can't they work a little earlier in the day? And does there have to been motor noises at 11:00 pm at night like last night? Even with the windows closed I could still hear it.
