Subject: Concerns Regarding New Construction at 1122 Aster Ave

Hi Noren,

I'm a current resident at Sweetwood Terrace (wall distance away from the future construction at 1122 Aster Avenue.) I have several concerns that I would hope to be taken into consideration regarding the new construction.

1. LESS HOMES!

To start with, this neighborhood is already well packed with three town home sites, multiple apartment complexes and single family homes. We really do not need another fully packed town home site to burden the area, the parking situation and schools.

However if the City sees the need to build another town home sites, 34 homes now proposed by the builder is too big of a number. It means:

- **a)** Much higher population in the area, jeopardizing life qualities of existing residents, jeopardizing real estate prospect due to too high of a population.
- **b)** Much less kids' playground and more crowded schools.
- c) Given how many homes the builder has proposed, the amount of guest parking seems insufficient. This would possibly mean their guests would park at our site or on the street.
- **d)** Too close to our site. The 30 feet now proposed by the builder is merely unacceptable. On top of that, they have no regards towards adjusting floor plan to preserve privacy. They are planning on have master's bedroom facing master's bedroom and plant trees to block sight, which is purely idiomatic. Also, adjusting windows DO NOT work! The only solution is to make the distance much larger.

Therefore I hope the City Planners could demand: less homes, much further distance from our site (at least 50 feet.)

2. Exterior Color.

Now we do understand that no matter how far the new constructions are eventually away from our site, our lighting situation WILL be jeopardized. Therefore, I suggest the builders paint their new buildings a much lighter color than the brown they are proposing. A lighter exterior color would at least help by reflecting a bit of sunlight to our site.

3. No Pest-Enticing Trees

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Given how close the new constructions are to our site, I sincerely hope the City Planners demand builders take measures to lower noise and air pollution during construction. One approach could be completing the east most building first (the one facing directly at our site,) so that it blocks future noise and pollution generated, if at all.
