



Frequent all-day service following patterns of:

- Density
- Walkability
- Linearity
- Proximity
- Mixed Land Uses



What is the Purpose of Public Transit?

Ridership Goal: "Think like a business"

- Focus where ridership potential is highest
- Support dense and walkable development
- Reduce automobile vehicle miles traveled
- Maximize cost-effectiveness of public funds
- Fewer routes, but with greater frequency




What is the Purpose of Public Transit?

Coverage Goal: "Think like a government service"

- "Access for all"
- Support suburban low-density development
- Lifeline access for everyone
- More routes, but with less frequency

Summer 2016 Community Engagement: Tradeoff Survey


Build a grid network




Existing Grid of Frequent Routes






Proposed Expanded Grid of Frequent Routes






Existing Rapid Service






Proposed Rapid Service






BART Connections - Milpitas

Buses & Light Rail Trains Per Hour




BART Connections - Berryessa






Proposed Light Rail Network






More Residents and Jobs on Frequent Network



Within half a mile of 15-minute or better service








Transit/walking access in 45 minutes 12:00 PM









Transit/walking access in 60 minutes 12:00 PM



Related Efforts

Measure B

\$500 million over 30 years (\$16.7 million per year) is eligible to be used for transit:

- Expand mobility services and affordable fare programs for seniors, disabled, students and low-income riders
- Enhance frequent core bus network
- Improve amenities at bus stops to increase safety, security and access
- Support new innovative transit service models to address first/last mile connections



Related Efforts

Paratransit Policy Update

Update paratransit policy so that no current paratransit users in Santa Clara County are negatively impacted (access to paratransit or fares) by transit network changes.

Core Connectivity

Exploring service models that are a better fit for suburban land use patterns

- Contributions to city shuttle programs
- Subsidizing rides made by on-demand services



Related Efforts

Fare Study

Design of the transit network and fare policy work in harmony

- Evaluate free transfers
- Base fare change (\$2.00 to \$2.25 or \$2.50)
- Youth and EcoPass pricing
- Continuation or expansion of TAP Program (low-income passes)
- Community bus fare elimination







Proposed Transit Network






Transit/walking access in 30 minutes 8:00 AM






Transit/walking access in 45 minutes 8:00 AM


