CAP 2.0 INITIATIVE WORK PLAN

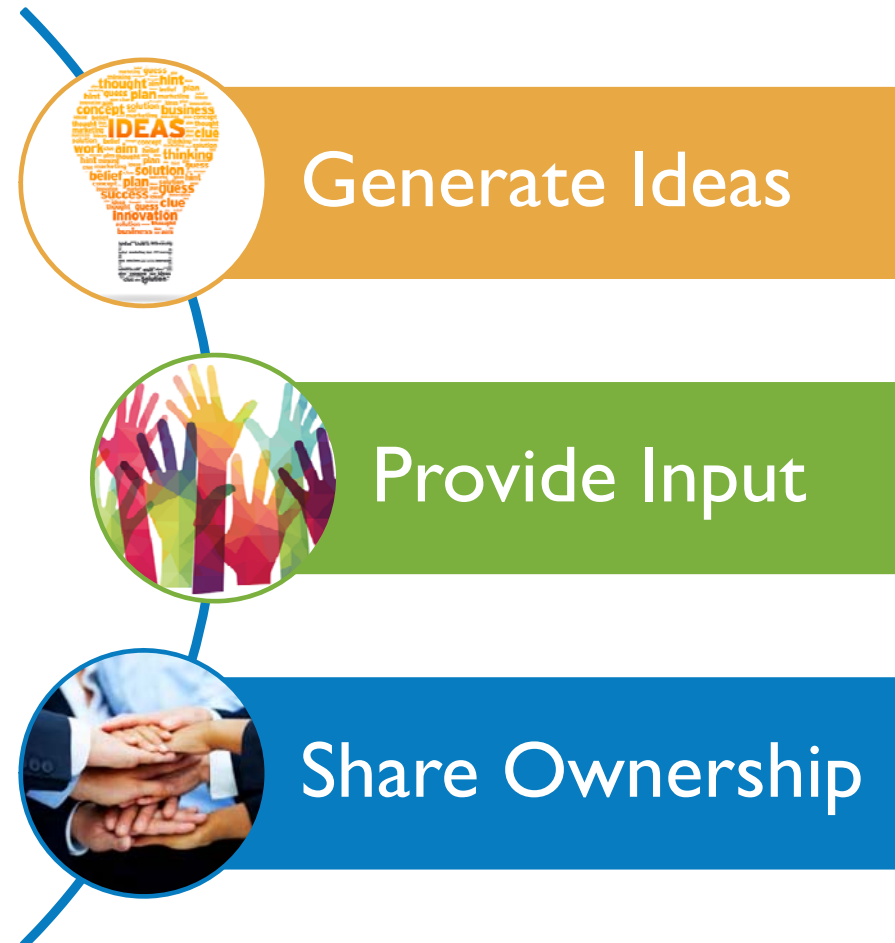
Next generation of strategies to achieve bold reductions – 40% and 80% below 1990 levels
