If Council approves the funding, each neighborhood group is eligible to apply for and receive a grant of up to \$1,000. Applicants will be notified of award decisions in July 2018.

Neighborhood Group/Association Background

1. When was your neighborhood group or association formed and why? What are the geographic boundaries of your group? How many households are included?

Our group was established in the spring of 2018, after a very well-attended Meet-Your-Neighbor disaster preparedness meeting. Our group quickly built a strong bond. We'd like to strengthen this bond and have increased opportunity for communication by hosting a neighborhood block party.

Our boundaries includes the houses and apartment complexes on Parkington Avenue between S Knickerbocker and S Bernardo. Parkington Avenue is a residential street in the Cherry Chase neighborhood of Sunnyvale. It includes approximately 19 single family homes and 11 apartment complexes, each consisting of an average of six units, for a total of population of approximately 150.

- 2. We are a newly established neighborhood coalition and, as such, do not yet have any activities or budget resources, except for the well-attended Meet-Your-Neighbor disaster response meeting. This grant application is our first attempt at securing funds. Thank you very much for considering us!

- 3. Our first annual Neighborhood Block Party will consist of gathering on our street and sharing food and drink together. Specifically, we'll have a BBQ complete with hot dogs, toppings, chips, vegetable trays, and water. We will request a street closure and obtain the necessary permit from the City of Sunnyvale.

Making the gathering rather open-ended allows for the residents of Parkington Avenue to share their own hobbies and skills. Flyers created in advance of the day will encourage folks to bring their skills to the event. For example, one resident plans to volunteer her time setting up a face painting booth for children.

Approximately 30 neighbors support this event. We asked neighbors at our most recent meeting if they would be interested in a block party and the yes vote was unanimous! We anticipate serving approximately 60-80 people at a block party, given the many residents of the apartment complexes.

- 4. How did you choose this project and/or event? Describe the outreach you have done to generate awareness and support in your neighborhood around the project and/or event. How many neighbors are in support and how did you determine that number?
- 4. We chose to host a Neighborhood Block Party through a brainstorming and group discussion of neighbors. We've reached out to over 30 residents who are excited to attend. As the date draws nearer we plan to canvas the street with fliers describing the event details. We expect a crowd of approximately 60-80 people to attend. (Of course, since this will be our first year it is difficult to predict how many neighbors will attend.)

- 6. The unique design of the houses on Parkington Avenue encourage folks to build enclosed front yards which means it can be difficult to meet your neighbors. You may have to enter a fence or find yourself locked out of the inner courtyard altogether. The large number of people living in the apartment complexes also makes building relationships rather challenging: the complexes have a higher turnover rate than the single family homes. We believe that our Neighborhood Block Party will be an excellent way to strengthen our street's community and communication.
