If Council approves the funding, each neighborhood group is eligible to apply for and receive a grant of up to \$1,000. Applicants will be notified of award decisions in July 2018.

Mission - The Stevens Creek Neighbors Association is committed to establishing and maintaining a vibrant community that is dedicated to promoting the safety, character and quality of our neighborhood, while also providing active stewardship to conserve the unique natural habitat of the Stevens Creek wildlife corridor.

Geographic Boundaries – Members of this association reside between Fremont Avenue and to Homestead Avenue, Highway 85 and the Stevens Creek border with Los Altos.

2. Describe your neighborhood group's activities and the resources that support those activities. If yours is a formal association, what is the annual budget? How do you raise funds?

Our Donate & Dump event is held in May. A Goodwill Truck and The City of Sunnyvale provides dumpsters in our neighborhood. What money is earned from the Goodwill donations is donated to Sunnyvale Community Services. Neighbors can donate and dump within the same block. The dumpsters are on one street and the Goodwill Truck on the other.

Our NNO is also a fundraiser for Sunnyvale Community Services. Neighbors donate diapers and toilet paper and then we have a relay race with two groups of kids. To win they have to get all of the various sized packages for diapers & TP over the line. We also host a block party and neighbors pitch in snacks and desserts. We have a lot of fun and we also have Animals.

Last year the Donate & Dump event was a huge success. Neighbors filled up 6 dumpsters of junk and the Goodwill donations earned SCS \$900 dollars. Neighbors were super excited about the event and I got lots of great feedback! This year we will have even more participants.

Our NNO is usually held the weekend after school starts on a Sunday afternoon 4-6. As we have a lot of families in the neighborhood the timing works because sports and after school events haven't started yet. Our neighborhood is small and has 365 homes. Last year at NNO we had 90 - 100 attendees. The focus is about donations to SCS and neighbors getting to know neighbors in a casual setting. We also have a scavenger hunt for kids, teens and adults. We have a questionnaire that requires neighbors to ask questions of each other, fill out a form and then put it into boxes to win prizes. A realtor in the neighborhood donates a few prizes which is really helpful. Money for more prizes to get more neighbors out of their homes to meet other neighbors would be really helpful.

4. How did you choose this project and/or event? Describe the outreach you have done to generate awareness and support in your neighborhood around the project and/or event. How many neighbors are in support and how did you determine that number?

The Donate & Dump event was such a success and interesting in that folks met each other when donating to Goodwill and at the City of Sunnyvale dumpsters. Neighbors were really excited about being able to raise funds for SCS with the Goodwill truck and then getting rid of junk in the dumpsters. This year we are planning for the two weeks ahead of D & D for neighbors to put out items in good shape that they don't want. The next event is encouraging neighbors to contact the City of Sunnyvale to have a once a year bulk pick up. Lastly D & D.

NNO & D&D are advertised on Nextdoor, our private Yahoo group and by the signage that I create.
