

Existing Site




Phase I

Environmental Review Timeline

Draft Program Environmental Impact Report (DEIR)

- 45-day Public Review (April 23, 2018 to June 7, 2018)
- Heritage Preservation Commission May 2, 2018
- Planning Commission May 29, 2018

Final Program Environmental Impact Report (FEIR)

• Published August 23, 2018

Different Levels of Impacts Identified in the EIR

- Significant and Unavoidable Impacts
- Significant Impacts that can be Mitigated
- Less than Significant
- No Impact

Significant and Unavoidable Impacts

- Cultural and Tribal Cultural Resources
- Noise

Significant and Unavoidable Impacts

Cultural and Tribal Cultural Resources

- Civic Center Campus eligible for listing in the California Register as Historic District
- 2. City Hall and Sunnyvale Office Center are independently eligible for listing in the California Register

Noise

- 1. Noise associated with demolition and construction
- 2. Noise related to sirens used at DPS HQ and secured parking area if moved to Charles St

Mitigation Measures

- Cultural 1: Documentation of Historic District
- Cultural 2: Documentation of City Hall
- Cultural 3: Documentation of SOC
- Cultural 4: Archival of the Historic Plans
- Cultural 5: Cultural Resources Sensitivity Training and Inadvertent Discovery
- Cultural 6: Paleontological Resources Sensitivity Training and Inadvertent Discovery
- Cultural 7: Human Remains
- Cultural 8: Tribal Cultural Resources Inadvertent Discovery
- Noise 1: Noise Management Plan
- Noise 2: Mechanical Equipment
- Noise 3: Construction Impacts on the Library
- Noise 4: Noise at Schools

- 1. No Project Alternative
- Greater environmental impact
 - Seismic hazard, water quality, public services, stormwater runoff and energy resources
- 2. Maintain Existing DPS HQ Location
- Environmentally superior alternative
 - Avoid Significant and Unavoidable Noise Impact

Recommendation

Forward Recommendations to the City Council to:

- 1. Adopt a Resolution to:
 - a) Certify the EIR
 - b) Make the Finding Required by the California Environmental Quality Act; and
 - c) Adopt the Statement of Overriding Considerations and Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program.
- 2. Adopt the Resolution as stated in Alternative 1 with modifications.
- 3. Do not Adopt a Resolution and provide direction to staff on necessary revisions.
