The purpose of this meeting was to share the input received through the online survey (available to the public from December 23, 2019 to January 12, 2020), present conceptual alternatives, and receive feedback from the public. An open-house style meeting was held at Washinaton Park prior to the standina Parks and Recreation Commission Meetina. Participants were each provided with 10 dot stickers to vote on the amenities they most preferred. Below is a summary of the comments heard at the meeting followed by the dot voting results. Comment cards and sign-in sheets are attached at the end of this summary.

#### Comments from community members:

- more programming at the plaza
- concerts to bring more people to the plaza
- garage cover in the Classic concept looks like a VTA station shelter
- fountain decreases flexible space, is not usable, can be played on, and requires maintenance
- a fireman's pole for play equipment
- a tire swing for play equipment
- better power supply for the stage
- existing infrastructure provides power but breakers trip



Mayor Klein, Vice-Mayor Smith and Council Members, Parks and Recreation Commissioners,

I will be unable to attend this outreach meeting on February 12<sup>th</sup>, so I am submitting comments by email.

For eight years, I worked in the Mozart buildings. As a result I was on Plaza Del Sol multiple times a day, so I am very familiar with this space. My employer, Broadcom, frequently held company events on the Plaza.

As a starting point, I suggest looking at European piazzas. Many of these have enriched their communities for centuries. We do not need to reinvent the wheel. There is an interesting article, "<u>Here's How American Cities Can Learn From Italian Piazzas</u>", which compares (unfavorably) the square around San Jose City Hall and Piazza Maggiore in Bologna, Italy.

Good piazzas are centrally located, like Plaza Del Sol, and have pedestrian paths that easily connect to nearby urban destinations -also true for Plaza Del Sol.

What is missing is an active, pedestrian scale ground floor at the edges of the Plaza. From the article mentioned above:

You would think this would be clear to everyone by now: Active and permeable ground floors are a sine qua non for the functioning of an urban plaza. This is what really provides Piazza Maggiore and most Italian Piazzas in general with the fuel and spark of their vibrancy. The monumental scale of the churches and palazzi is broken down to the human scale with the insertion of fine-grained bustling commercial activities. [in contrast] Look at San Jose City Hall Plaza and you will find a trade show of ground floor life-suckers: a vacant lot, a multilevel parking garage, a gas station and the parking lot for a big box retail complex wrap around the space, rendering any intent of the design of the plaza irrelevant.

With this in mind, here are some suggestions to "activate the edges" of the plaza.

1. Philz Coffee and The Don's Deli. As a frequent customer to these establishments, they are both often too crowded to sit down. They are losing business. An easy change would be to add outside seating with quality tables and chairs, a canopy for shade and possibly a low barrier for visual appeal. This could extend to Vitality Bowls as well. In contrast to the current handful of cheap tables, the view from the plaza would be people relaxing and having coffee or food in the open air.

- 2. 100 Mathilda Place. The bottom floor, facing the Plaza would be an excellent location for a restaurant, with outdoor seating. This part of the first floor is isolated from the rest of the office building by the lobby and there is parking directly below the building.
- 3. The new building replacing the post office and apartments. Similarly, the ground floor of this building should include pedestrian scale locations such as restaurants or shops. The developer may not like this idea, and you will be informed that retail is dead. But somehow, it is almost impossible to get into Santana Row and it is actually impossible to park at Valley Fair most of the time.

The Evelyn Avenue side is a little more problematic. More retail locations would be nice, but this is on top of the parking garage, so I am not sure how much weight it will bear. Possibly, a row of booths, similar to what we see at the Farmers Market would work, selling jewelry or clothing. Maybe Silicon Valley souvenirs.

In the center of the square, how about some seating around a fountain or planted area. The open space should still be able to accommodate a public gathering with a raised area for a stage.

When all of these elements are added, we need to open up one side of the Plaza so that residents can view this attractive public space. This would be along Frances. Currently, the view of the Plaza is blocked from this street. This should be opened up.

I hope there will be more outreach meetings about this important space in Downtown.
