## Local Redistricting Commissions in California Cities

Over 140 cities in California currently have district-based Council elections. Of those, only a fraction opt to use a redistricting commission. This spreadsheet compiles information on redistricting commissions throughout California. It is not comprehensive list as several cities that have recently transitioned to district-based elections have yet to determine their redistricting process, like Sunnyvale.
