I am a Sunnyvale resident in Ortega Park, and I have followed with interest the proposed development at 200 W. Washington Avenue (the "Macy's site").

With the current proposal, I was puzzled to see that Frances St. will be extended as a one-way road between the two buildings in the development. I kept asking myself, "Why do this?"

In terms of traffic flow, I don't see how adding a one-way road for cars will improve traffic flow or the transportation needs for the two projects. To me, this road disrupts the possibility of creating a unique pedestrian mall between the two buildings.

We have all witnessed the popularity of closing Murphy Ave. in the Historic District for outdoor dining during the pandemic. Retail destinations like Santana Row continue to experiment with restricting vehicles from core areas.

If the 200 W.
