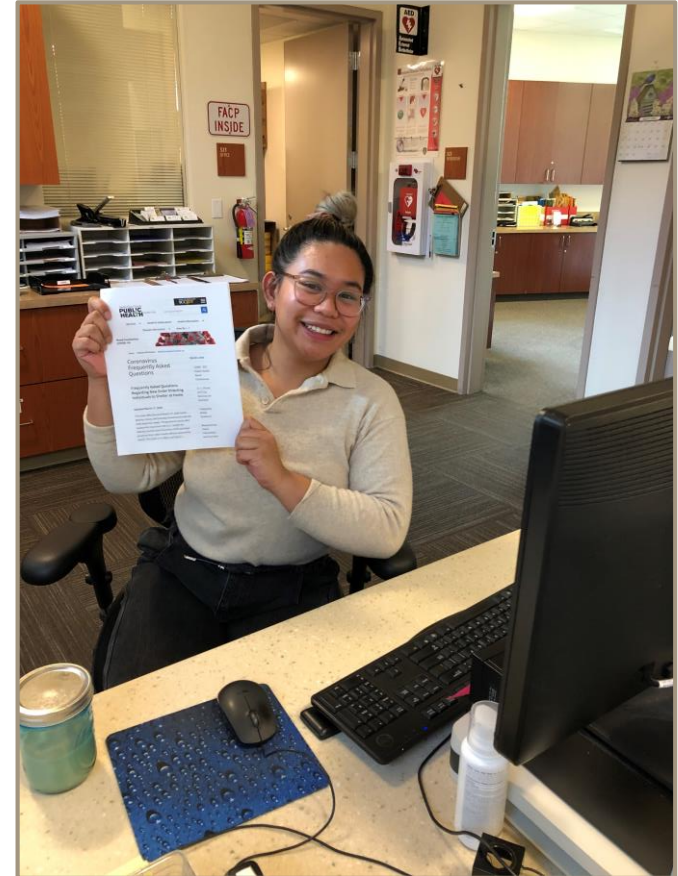

Other Senior Center Services

- Online programs/classes
- Care Management
- Partnering with other cities in the County to host a virtual Older Americans Month in May



Sports & Fields Update

- 155 registered participants in 17 youth sports classes for March – April
- 728 field reservations for March with special agreement groups
- Last weekend, March 5-7, entrance booth at Baylands Park was staffed and brought in \$9,500 from daily vehicle fees and season pass sales.



Aquatics Update

Since January:

- Lap Swim: 4,621 total visits; 1,690 were seniors (36%); 100 daily average; 650 weekly average
- Aqua Fitness Classes: 140 participants



From July to Dec. 2020, 3 pools (CMS pool, SMS pool & Sunnyvale Swim Center) were rented to private youth swim groups for 2,200 hours

Will be introducing a new, full-day aquatics + recreation camp this summer called Splash & Dash



Arts & Marketing

- Drop-In pottery studio hours will re-start next week with appts. – 3x/week
- Virtual HOTS event – Drive thru event, limited capacity (200). Tickets go on sale later this month on-line.
- 2021 Summer - Diverse offerings, full and half day options. Limited enrollment and must follow current health mandate guidelines. Brochure and registration will be available next week on-line.



Youth, Teens & Family Resources

- Distance Learning – Going strong, 1 classroom with 9 students
- Super Safari Preschool – 1 site with 10 students, at full capacity with a wait list
- Spring Break Offerings – 5 activities planned for April 12 – 16.
 - ♦ 1 virtual & 4 in-person, serving ages 6-18. Registration open now
