4. What motivated you to apply for this board or commission?

I have been a frequent user of Sunnyvale Public Library services since 2005 and a life-long aficionado of public libraries. They are my favorite places, and I have visited, patronized, and/or volunteered in many libraries throughout CA, the US, and internationally. I enjoy observing how different libraries work. When I became a librarian myself in 2019, I gained far more insight into the issues and challenges that libraries - both generally and extending to my own Sunnyvale library - face. I would like to use my skills and knowledge to contribute to improving the library for my community. University libraries such as where I work are different from public libraries in many ways and I would welcome an opportunity to learn more while bringing a unique and valuable perspective to the role.

5. What skills or attributes can you bring to this board or commission?

I bring in-depth, hands-on experience with many practical aspects of librarianship, including collection development, reference work, space planning, purchasing, management, and educational programming. As a librarian I specialize in electronic resources and so I understand the many challenges they pose for libraries.

At heart I am a data person. Prior to my work as a librarian, I spent about 9 years as a data analyst at Google in Mountain View and Sunnyvale. I am analytical, highly organized and detail-oriented, and a problem-solver. I'm also very good at taking notes. I have primarily a technical and STEM-oriented background, and experience with teaching those skills to others. I have a no-nonsense approach to my work, and am the person who "gets things done."

I am familiar with the services and materials that the Sunnyvale Public Library offers. I used the Library as an avid adult reader myself, and then gained an entirely new perspective as a parent of 2 avid readers who have grown up with the Library in their backyard.

6. The primary role of a board or commission member is to provide advice to City Council on policy issues that are within the scope of that board or commission. With this in mind, what steps would you take to effectively exercise this specific board or commission role?

Steps I would take include:

1. Be a user of as many Library services as possible, e.g. trying out all electronic platforms and new offerings.
2. Regularly attend a variety of Library programming and events.
3. Be an observer during my visits to the Library, particularly noting any pain points and difficulties for patrons as well as popular locations and services.
4. Carefully review the Library's public communications, e.g. website announcements and newsletters.
5. Do research and stay up-to-date on news and trends in public libraries in the Bay Area and around the country. My status as an ALA member grants many opportunities in this area.
6. Prepare diligently for Board meetings by reviewing any relevant documents beforehand; listen attentively to presentations; ask questions to ensure that I have as full an understanding as possible of the issue at hand.
7. When making my decisions, use all available information and weigh all viewpoints with care and objectivity.
8. I have not yet had an opportunity to work with City Council, so I will need to learn the appropriate format(s) in which to relay my thoughts.

8. Briefly describe your current or last occupation.

I am the Engineering Librarian for Data and Collections at Stanford University, where I support the instructional and research functions of the university. I am responsible for maintenance and management of the materials collection of the Terman Engineering Library, both physical and digital. I make all purchase decisions for our collections budget which is in the seven figures. I help run our data programs, which include managing researcher-created and commercial datasets and making them useful for our patrons. I manage a team that analyzes internal library data across the sciences and engineering, so that the Libraries can optimize purchasing and develop/execute a collections strategy. I teach workshops for the Stanford community on working with data in Python, among other technical topics. I am the steward for the Engineering Library's endowed materials funds, and make/maintain connections with our donors. I am also a reference librarian for questions relevant to all fields of engineering, and the library liaison to the Computer Science department.

9. Briefly describe what you learned by attending a meeting of the City Council, board or commission. Describe what improvements you would suggest the City consider.

While I have not attended a meeting of the Board, I have reviewed meeting minutes and associated documents afterward, for the past 18 months or so before and during the pandemic. I have a good grasp of the structure of the meetings, and more importantly an understanding of the scope of topics that the Board is asked to learn about and weigh in on. The scope is quite broad, from facilities to programming to electronic collections and more. Information about all these aspects of the library is shared transparently, both with the Board and subsequently with the public.

Board meetings are certainly highly structured, which I understand is necessary to comply with the requirements of any public hearing. For instance, it is great that any member of the public can speak to the Board but the process to do so is complex. It may be worth exploring additional ways to receive ideas and feedback from the public in more informal ways, perhaps through regular surveys and listening sessions. I would also like to see more interaction/participation with a broader swath of the Library staff, so that two-way communication and trust are increased. The Board should be closely connected to those whom they serve.

10. Describe your involvement in community activities, volunteer and civic organizations.

I am the incoming lead for the Great ABC Book Club in 2021-22 at Cumberland Elementary School. This role coordinates volunteers and materials for book clubs for fourth and fifth graders. I also volunteer annually in the Cumberland Walkathon fundraiser event.

From 2017-21, I was a member of the Board of the Amazing Creations Preschool in Sunnyvale. From 2018-21 I served as Secretary of the Board. I am a member of St. Luke Lutheran Church, with which the preschool is affiliated.

I am the principal second violinist for the Nova Vista Symphony, which rehearses at Lakewood Elementary and performs in venues around the south bay. I have been in the Symphony since 2008, and a principal since 2015. I have also performed at the Library as part of our "Instrument Petting Zoo" event.

I am currently a volunteer section teacher for Stanford's community service project "Code in Place", a 6-week online introduction to computer science class with over 12,000 students globally. My students hail from Germany, Hungary, Thailand, Nigeria, Japan, and more.

4. Community demographics and technology are constantly changing. What do you think are the principal issues the Sunnyvale Public Library may be addressing over the next few years?

1. The population of Sunnyvale has grown steadily over recent decades but the library space has not. The new Lakewood branch may reduce pressure temporarily, but the Library will need to be creative with its space and resources to maximize community satisfaction. The opening of a new branch will also bring many challenges and opportunities.
2. As new people move to Sunnyvale and the population continues to diversify, the Library will need to discover new means to reach folks and market services. The Library has been increasing its function as a community center with new products and programs - how will these reach as wide an audience as could benefit?
3. Demand for electronic resources is only going to increase, but platforms available to libraries leave much to be desired. Electronic resource providers tend to charge exorbitant prices, have draconian access policies/processes, and are of lower quality/usability than their commercial counterparts (e.g. Hoopla vs. Netflix). There will be many and increasing challenges in future to ensure the best experience for patrons.
4. In the immediate future, the Library will be addressing how to safely reopen as the pandemic winds down, from its tentative beginnings to (hopefully) full capacity and resumption of in-person programs. Stakeholders will likely have conflicting opinions, and careful listening and compromise will be in order.





2. Like many cities in Santa Clara County, Sunnyvale is faced with problems stemming from traffic congestion and air pollution. Suggest ways the City can improve facilities for bicyclists and improve bicycling education and safety programs for motorists, cyclists and pedestrians?

I think that a contiguous bike lane along both sides of El Camino Real would make it easier to bike to dozens of local businesses instead of driving. It would also speed up bicycling going East-West and make it a more useful travel option (as there are already dedicated bike trails going North-South like Stevens' Creek).

As for safety and education programs, I think the city could benefit from a low-budget informational ad campaign on social media/search platforms targeted locally. While I'm a little biased, I think these ads would be more informative than the average display ad, and much more cost-effective than distributing flyers or other informational texts. I think that these programs could benefit from internet distribution as community engagement gets increasingly digital and online.

Planning Commission:

12. Sunnyvale has limited vacant land for new development. This could increase pressure for redevelopment of existing developed areas. How can planning respond to this situation?

Given rising homelessness and costs of living, new housing stock is critical. This means that available vacant land needs to be developed as efficiently as possible, and that some redevelopment will be inevitable. Some practical ways I think the land could be developed more efficiently include reducing parking lot requirements with more bike-friendly parking, and moving forward with existing proposals to redevelop available single-family lots into duplexes/triplexes.

13. Planning Commissioners are often asked to consider social, economic and environmental issues when reviewing proposals. How does one achieve a balanced community?

While the exact optimal balance for a community is subjective, there seems to be consensus on particular social and environmental issues. I think the best way towards a balanced community is to research other communities that either had or have similar areas for improvement. For example, when discussing tension between those who live in parked vehicles and the neighboring households, the commission looked towards Mountain View and San Jose who implemented measures for a similar issue.

While this empirical approach doesn't posit an ideal balanced community, it makes room for do-able and sometimes counterintuitive solutions that can incrementally improve the community.



Additionally, the existing Planning Commission has been working well together for several years but is about to have significant turnover as members term out. If I were appointed to the upcoming vacancy, I would have a good amount of time to learn from veteran members of the Commission and be then able to pay that knowledge forward to future new Commissioners.

5. What skills or attributes can you bring to this board or commission?

I bring a strong attention to detail as well as a firm belief in procedural fairness. I like to examine closely anything that I am asked to approve and am quite willing to suggest changes when appropriate. At the same time, I generally try to bring a systems/process-oriented approach to questions I am presented with. (I pick up procedures that may have been initially unfamiliar to me very quickly.) On a project level, this means following existing processes and standards and allowing the findings that I can make to guide decisions. On a broader land use level, this means recommending an outline for future use that will serve the City and future occupants the best while in line with existing City policies and values.

6. The primary role of a board or commission member is to provide advice to City Council on policy issues that are within the scope of that board or commission. With this in mind, what steps would you take to effectively exercise this specific board or commission role?

The study issue process permits commissioners to propose study issues for (after Commission ranking, etc.) Council consideration, and I would seek to propose study issues on any relevant policy questions within the scope of the Planning Commission. I would also look to provide useful recommendations on land use and zoning decisions that take into account stakeholder advice and interests while also ultimately best serve the future of Sunnyvale.

I received my Bachelor of Science from Harvey Mudd College in 2009 as a computer science major. While in college I was also secretary of the student council's Dormitory Affairs Committee (which, among other things, oversaw the annual room selection process) for two years and moderator of the all-student mailing list (which required interpretation of existing list policies, as previously enacted by the student council, to determine which emails should be approved and which rejected) my senior year.

8. Briefly describe your current or last occupation.

I am currently a software engineer charged with quality assurance for DataGlance, Inc. I design and implement automated tests to be run when our products are updated, as well as manual tests for cases that are not well covered by automation.

9. Briefly describe what you learned by attending a meeting of the City Council, board or commission. Describe what improvements you would suggest the City consider.

I've learned a lot about City design standards, including floor-area ratio requirements, setback requirements, the urban canopy, specific architectural styles, and privacy elements. I've also seen the improvements that come from initial Commissioner feedback at study sessions.

The biggest improvement I'd suggest would involve finding a way to accelerate the feedback loop between commissions and City Council. It might also be nice to have a TCMAC equivalent for the Planning Commission so the public can know when specific items will come up.

Finally, the switch to remote meetings made it impossible for applicants to, say, provide material samples to Commissioners, and while the ability to provide remote public comment is important and should continue after COVID restrictions ease, there is also a lot of value in being able to give a presentation in person. We should look at balancing these interests going forward.

10. Describe your involvement in community activities, volunteer and civic organizations.

I have been Political Director and Parliamentarian of the Sunnyvale Democratic Club for the past two years. I also participated in the district map-drawing process that concluded in early 2020, and was involved in the successful Measure B campaign. Particularly in the process of refining my (and working with others') proposed maps, I interacted with a number of different Sunnyvale "communities of interest" and learned a lot about different neighborhoods and which parts of the City had important similarities and differences to other parts.

Outside of Sunnyvale, I spent six years as a Gameplay Coordinator for United States Quidditch. The Gameplay team was responsible for both various policy decisions (usually made in the off-season), design of regional and national championship tournaments, and in-season enforcement of our league policies, sometimes resulting in either player or team discipline.

Planning Commission:

12. Sunnyvale has limited vacant land for new development. This could increase pressure for redevelopment of existing developed areas. How can planning respond to this situation?

First, we should be ensuring that currently vacant land (including new vacancies, like the Fry's site) be developed in a way that reflects community needs and demands, consistent with current City policies. Second, we should explore ways to permit current property owners to be able to develop and redevelop their properties in ways that, while not inconsistent with the general tenor of their neighborhood, allow for greater local density. Some of this is going to be mandated by existing/potential state law but we should be proactive in establishing processes to promote quality projects that improve the city while not displacing existing residents.

13. Planning Commissioners are often asked to consider social, economic and environmental issues when reviewing proposals. How does one achieve a balanced community?

On a macro level, jobs/housing balance is important so as to ensure that housing demand doesn't make housing completely unaffordable, or that offices and other job sites aren't sitting vacant (which may be something we need to reexamine post-COVID). On a smaller scale, it's important to make sure that people can get from where they live to where they work and where they shop, including people who don't have a car or just want to limit how much they drive. A balanced community should also have a wide variety of ages, with both easy access to schools and infrastructure to allow older residents to age-in-place. Finally, residents should have access to recreation both via parks and other facilities and simply by being able to safely walk or bike around their neighborhood, which should be an aesthetically pleasant experience featuring quality architecture, trees, and other ecologically appropriate landscaping.

9. Community demographics are constantly changing. What do you think are the principal issues this Commission may be addressing over the next few years?

Sunnyvale's population has steadily climbed to over 150,000 while the construction of new single family homes (for sale) has remained relatively flat. As such, residents are moving into more shared dwellings (i.e. condominiums/ townhouses) that allow for less personal outdoor space. This means public areas such as parks will be in greater demand and the commission will be tasked with researching innovated use cases as well as ensuring a varied range of programming offered by Parks and Recreation to fit the needs of such a diverse community (e.g. ethnicity, age, physical ability). Moreover, as high tech continues to be a staple attracting those to our city, many either come to live in Sunnyvale with young families or will soon be expanding their families. Programming should take into account the needs of these burgeoning families while simultaneously remaining inclusive to those in other age groups. Also as the ethnic composition of the city is changing, more research should be conducted on how to best celebrate and highlight the various ethnic groups to further build stronger relationships between community members. Additional research should be conducted by the commission to see if park usage is increasing proportional to population growth and how the commission can ensure our open spaces are being used by all our different residents.

To me, the key factor that makes someone more likely to bike or walk instead of driving is convenience and safety. For cycling, this means:

- 1) Safe routes: Routes that preference bikes over cars, e.g. bike boulevards or separate paths.
- 2) Convenient routes: Sunnyvale has many neighborhoods that were designed to minimize vehicular through-traffic, but this has had the side effect of forcing bikes onto busy roads with cars. Connecting dead ends/cul-de-sacs for bike traffic would allow cyclists to choose safe *and* efficient routes.

With regards to outreach and education: identifying, creating and adding signage for designated bike routes may be an effective way to educate people on what bike commuting options are available.






