



## Sunnyvale Redistricting Commission Recruitment Announcement and Application

*(Interviews tentatively scheduled for June 17)*

### Background

Sunnyvale must re-draw its six Council district boundaries using new 2020 Census data. This process is called redistricting. All cities with district-based election systems, like Sunnyvale, must redistrict after each Census. This keeps population counts within each district relatively equal to ensure equal representation. Sunnyvale adopted district boundaries in 2019 using 2010 Census total population counts. We must now reevaluate districts using the new census data.

### Role of the Redistricting Commission

The Redistricting Commission will facilitate the process of adjusting Council district boundaries for elections between 2022 and 2030. It will hold public hearings to gather public input. The Commission will submit 3-5 draft map proposals to Council based on community input and select one preferred map. Commissioners should be open-minded, impartial, and community-minded. The Council's goal is that the Redistricting Commission will represent the geographic, ethnic, and social diversity of the City. I have years of experience building communities and engaging with diverse and sometimes conflicting viewpoints. As a person who started my career as a software engineer at Apple, I understand the viewpoints of industry. I also see where they are short sighted and dont always apply the most consistent philosophies, resulting in underserved people and sometimes putright injustice. Growing up in a farm town, both my parents worked in a grape packing facility and from a young age I was exposed to both conservative and progressive viewpoints with regards to labor, finances, and social policy. Due to my diverse range of unique experiences, I believe I would be a valuable asset to this committee.

Describe your approach to analytical decision making when faced with competing priorities and values.

I believe in the value of interdisciplinary persoectives and I have seen first hand the magic that can happen when people from diverse backgrounds are given a safe environment to engage in productive discourse. My approach to decision making is to create and establish a place of mutual respect and create ground rules that allow difficult but important conversations to yield productive results.

The value of leaning in and putting yourself in other peoples shoes cannot be understated. People of different perspectives are not opponents but rather partners in solving a problem together. When you accept this, everything changes.

Why are you interested in serving on the Redistricting Commission and what are your objectives?

I believe that elections and City decisions should be based on the needs of the community, and district boundaries is a way to get voices heard. Sunnyvale is very diverse, not only in terms of ethnicity, but also in family size, professions, age, etc. Many changes are happening in our City that residents should actively participate in.

In my case, I have lived in Sunnyvale for 25 years and would like Sunnyvale to continue to be a "City of Choice" that we can all be proud of. I believe that actively participating in local activities with the City of Sunnyvale is one of the ways that I can contribute.

I worked for a large corporation, and was the Managing Director for their office in Sunnyvale to build up its Silicon Valley presence. The objective of both these groups was to provide information to help leadership and employees make data-based decisions. Both were strong and innovative organizations and information helped support or debunk new product development or process improvement ideas and proposals.

Describe your approach to analytical decision making when faced with competing priorities and values.

Decisions vary in magnitude, impact, cost drivers, complexity, and urgency, and the approach to dealing with competing priorities need to be weighed against these factors. I was very much involved in large capital projects and new product ideas - many of them seem to be ideal initiatives, but not all can be done - based on the resources on hand (time, budget, materials, and people) hard decisions had to be made.

In my management role in approving projects, my approach was:

- 1) To understand the potential impact and benefits of the list of project proposals, the effort to implement, and resources needed to maintain. Get more information if I or the team have questions.
- 2) Work with the team to rank/rate these projects based on the strategic goals (will it make money, can it be done in xx months, impact, etc.)
- 3) Develop a short list of the best projects. If appropriate, get more details about each of the shortlisted projects from the project owners/experts, and get other subject matter experts to weigh in or make their case.
- 4) At this point, I and/or the team can usually make a selection since we worked collaboratively on the rating, ranking, and priorities. If not, we discuss further. If appropriated, we present the best options to leadership or other stakeholders to get additional perspective, to make a final selection, or work out a compromise.

Throughout the process, I am very clear about the selection criteria and the steps in my (or my team's) decision making process. It has always been part of my process to communicate and involved the stakeholders.

Describe your approach to analytical decision making when faced with competing priorities and values.


1. US Constitution and Bill of Rights are 2nd and 3rd bibles.





As such, I've recruited a large number of youth umpires and guided them to take on what is really their first adult role -- umpiring a game. I've been on the board of Metro for about five years and coached many teams over the years. This has led me to build close relationships with people in the Birdland, Ponderosa, Gavello Glen, Ortega Park, and Panama Park neighborhoods.

In the past, I was a member of the Yes on Measure A Campaign, which was the culmination of my efforts to move Sunnyvale to by-district council elections. I was one of the four potential plaintiffs in the potential lawsuit against the city. To keep the lawsuit from occurring, I actively participated in the "Unity Group" in drawing the maps that council ultimately selected. Before that, I developed and shared several maps with the public. Those maps became the basis of nearly every map that was in consideration at the end.

Describe your experience, training, knowledge and/or skills which qualify you for appointment to this commission.

Aside from my civic involvement that shows my deep understanding and connection to Sunnyvale, my professional position is Senior Principal in the Data and Analytics practice at Slalom Consulting. I construct data solutions and analyze data for a living. That means I can look at tables of statistics and explain to others what conclusions are reasonable based on the data. Just as importantly, I can explain what conclusions are not reasonable. Understanding the limits of possible insights from data is just as important as the analysis itself. I am quite familiar with the Census Bureau datasets and whether I'm on the commission or not, will spend a lot of time with the 2020 data when it is released.

Data is one thing, but on the ground experience improves data analysis and synthesis exponentially. I run and bicycle for pleasure. My children's activities have led me to run and bicycle in nearly every Sunnyvale neighborhood including several of the largest mobile home communities. I understand where the maps don't match up to the actual human geography. Two communities can look connected on a map while there are barriers that keep the people separate. But sometimes, there are "secret passages" between them. You only know where those exist if you're on foot or bicycle.

Next, I regularly chair Livable Sunnyvale meetings and special events. I know how to participate in and even

Describe your approach to analytical decision making when faced with competing priorities and values.

The first step is to listen. Listen closely to those communicating why certain priorities and perspectives are important. Don't just listen to the words. Watch their body language and ask questions for clarification if needed. The next step is to review the prioritization information given by the governing group. Everyone should be operating from the same prioritization rubric. Make sure that is true. Then the real work begins.

Perfect is the enemy of "done." Compromises will have to be made. Accept that. I like to put all the data "on the table". Doing that will often show that the discussion has gotten stuck on a small detail that may not actually be an issue. If you're following, I try to do everything reasonable to make sure we don't have a conflict first.

So when there is an actual conflict, we stick to the facts and data as much as possible. The data can be what's been said in various forums. But of course, we don't want to overweight public comment or Internet posts. Data from both of those overweights specific demographics. Then I break things down. I score proposals on each prioritization factor and apply weights as implied or detailed by the governance



### Background

Sunnyvale must re-draw its six Council district boundaries using new 2020 Census data. This process is called redistricting. All cities with district-based election systems, like Sunnyvale, must redistrict after each Census. This keeps population counts within each district relatively equal to ensure equal representation. Sunnyvale adopted district boundaries in 2019 using 2010 Census total population counts. We must now reevaluate districts using the new census data.

### Role of the Redistricting Commission

The Redistricting Commission will facilitate the process of adjusting Council district boundaries for elections between 2022 and 2030. It will hold public hearings to gather public input. The Commission will submit 3-5 draft map proposals to Council based on community input and select one preferred map. Commissioners should be open-minded, impartial, and community-minded. The Council's goal is that the Redistricting Commission will represent the geographic, ethnic, and social diversity of the City. 
