Teens will then select one of two pre-burned screen slogans, "Future Voter" or "We the People", to be printed on their artwork. - The Annual Sunnyvale Art Club Exhibition is scheduled for Saturday, June 9 and Sunday, June 10 from noon to 5 p.m. at Sunnyvale Public Library. The work of more than forty local artists will be on display during the annual exhibition and outdoor painting demonstrations will also be held on the Library plaza.
