Pursuant to Section 3 of Executive Order N-29-20, issued by Governor Newsom on March 17, 2020, the meeting was conducted telephonically.

Mayor Klein called the meeting to order at 7:01 p.m. via teleconference.

City Clerk David Carnahan read the following oral comments received via email:

Sue Serrone, Livable Sunnyvale requested the City take additional action in response to the COVID-19 Pandemic, including providing support for renters, mobile home owners, the homeless and small businesses.

Richard Mehlinger voiced support for additional methods for the public to provide input during teleconference City Council meetings generally and for the Active Transportation Plan in particular.

City Clerk David Carnahan read the following public comments received via email:

James Uren shared opposition to the proposed moratorium on evictions for non-payment of rent due to the COVID-19 Pandemic and raised concerns regarding the potential impacts to landlords.

Leia Mehlman voiced support for the inclusion of mobile home park tenants in the eviction moratorium.

Annette Kirkham, Law Foundation of Silicon Valley communicated support for the eviction moratorium and expansion of the proposed eviction moratorium to include no fault evictions and protection for small businesses.

Richard Mehlinger, Livable Sunnyvale and the Sunnyvale Democratic Club Executive Board shared support for the eviction moratorium and expansion of the moratorium to prohibit all evictions.

Anil Babbar, Vice President of Public Affairs, California Apartment Association voiced opposition to the eviction moratorium and detailed possible impacts to landlords.

Public Hearing closed at 8:46 p.m.

MOTION: Councilmember Hendricks moved and Vice Mayor Smith seconded the motion to approve Alternative 1: adopt an Emergency Ordinance and introduce a Regular Ordinance enacting a moratorium on evictions for non-payment of rent by residential tenants impacted by the COVID-19 Pandemic (Attachments 1 and 2 to the report).

Mayor Klein confirmed projects not identified as essential will be preserved in their current state to support construction resuming after the Shelter in Place Order expires or is lifted.

MOTION: Councilmember Goldman moved to agendize a discussion of a City of Sunnyvale hiring freeze, exempting Department of Public Safety personnel and other specific positions.

Motion failed due to the lack of a second.

City Manager Kent Steffens advised the Office of the City Manager is reviewing all hiring requisitions during the Shelter in Place Order to ensure City hiring focuses on filling essential positions.
